 - (d) Such referendum was conducted under the supervision of the General Treasurer duly designated by the undersigned to conduct such referendum; and employees;
 - (e) A majority of the eligible employees voted in favor of including service in positions covered by the Retirement System of the Housing Authority of the City of Providence, Rhode Island, under the agreement entered into on December 20, 1951 by the State of Rhode Island and the Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare pursuant to section 218 of the Social Security Act.
