The Monthly Meeting of the Retirement Board was called to order at 9:05 a.m. Wednesday, September 13, 2017, in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor Conference Room, 50 Service Avenue, Warwick, RI.

#### I. Roll Call of Members

The following members were present at roll call: General Treasurer Seth Magaziner; Vice Chair William B. Finelli; Roger P. Boudreau; Mark A. Carruolo; Brian M. Daniels; Michael DiBiase; Paul L. Dion, Ph.D.; Thomas M. Lambert; John P. Maguire; Thomas A. Mullaney; Claire M. Newell; Marcia B. Reback; Jean Rondeau and Dr. Laura Shawhughes. Also in attendance: Frank J. Karpinski, ERSRI Executive Director and Attorney Michael P. Robinson, Board Counsel.

Recognizing a quorum, Treasurer Magaziner called the meeting to order.

Marianne F. Monte was absent from the meeting.

#### II. Approval of Minutes

On a motion by Marcia B. Reback and seconded by Roger P. Boudreau it was unanimously **VOTED: To approve the draft regular minutes of the July 12, 2017 meeting of the Retirement Board of the Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island.**

#### III. Chairperson's Report

##### **Quarterly Update on the Investment Portfolio as of June 30, 2017 by Chief Investment Officer Alec Stais**

Treasurer Magaziner introduced Alec Stais, Chief Investment Officer, to present the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017 investment portfolio update to the Board. Mr. Stais said his report reflects the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017 comparing the Plan versus the Benchmark and displaying the total aggregation of the Defined Benefit Plan. Mr. Stais said for period ending June 30, 2017, the reported return numbers were 11.62% which exceeded the 11.34% benchmark portfolio and well surpassed the 60/40 blend return of 10.80%, net of all the management and performance fees.

Mr. Stais said the 3-year returns were not as strong at 4.41% though ahead of the 60/40 blend and benchmark portfolio at 4.03% and 4.30%. He said the 5-year returns which are more relevant and longer-term was 7.80%, outperforming the 60/40 blend and benchmark portfolio which posted at 7.27% and 7.70%, respectively. He said the first two and one-half months of this fiscal year had relatively strong equity returns and noted that the volatility overall has been stable.

Mr. Dion asked what are the returns for the longer term; namely, for the 5-20 year results. Mr. Stais said the 10-year was 4.4% for the plan, 4.3% for the benchmark and 4.4% for the 60/40 blend noting the 2008-2009 financial crisis that affected these results. Mr. Dion asked if there are numbers beyond the 10-year mark, and Mr. Stais said he would be able to provide those numbers starting in year 2000, it was 4.9%. Mr. Dion said since the 7.0% rate of return for the actuarial 30-year plan is analyzed, he asked if there can be an alignment of what is projected and what was the actual performance over the similar time as he felt those records would be informative as to what the actuarial assumptions are made and advantageous to compare to other pension plans' assumptions.

Mr. Stais said he would do more research to determine relevant peer groups since cash flow patterns and actuarial status determine asset allocation and thus returns.

In conclusion, Mr. Stais said a proper diversification is the goal of the plan currently consisting of 55% growth; 37% stability and 8% income and he said the plan is not that far away from the target allocations.

Treasurer Magaziner then introduced Messrs. Matthew DiCroce, Director, Institutional Investment Strategy and David Iden, Relationship Manager, Institutional Relationships from TIAA Financial Services.

Mr. Iden started with a summary of data for all the plans, stating that total plan assets were \$694,525,322 as of June 30, 2017. He noted the total contributions were \$111,748,511 over a rolling 12 month-period. He said that 91% of assets are held in Vanguard Lifecycle trusts, a desired diversified investment vehicle. He noted that in the 401(a) Defined Contribution Plan there were \$692,119,280 in total plan assets as of June 30, 2017.

Mr. Dion asked Mr. Iden about the multi asset and if the Trust II is no longer available. Mr. Iden said these are moving from a higher share class to a lower share class, thus still reflected in the data. He then asked if they will still show up in the Trust I, and Mr. Iden said yes even though there are no assets but there are contributions. Mr. Dion then asked when he looks at the Trust I asset percentage total, is there any skew based on age where someone may be older but needs to be in a lower age category due to working longer possibly. Mr. Dion asked if something can be provided at a future meeting.

Mr. Iden noted the Q2 2017 benefit fairs, seminars, workshop and one-on-ones totaled 709 attendees.

Mr. Boudreau asked who the attendees were in the State of RI Retiree Group Meetings held across the State. Mr. Iden said these are active members obtaining education on the DC Plan. Mr. Iden also said there are specific locations where one-on-one meetings take place and where other locations are grouped with individual communication.

Mr. Iden provided the Board the breakdown of statistics of workshops historically by gender, average balance and by group with individual sessions. Treasurer Magaziner said the numbers have come up significantly over the last couple of years with the outreach and interaction and commended TIAA for their work, and Mr. Iden acknowledged it is a team effort.

Next Mr. DiCroce provided an investment summary. Mr. Maguire asked relative to the *Employees Participating in Meetings in 2017* report of the Plan Review about the average balance for males is almost 0.5 million, which is quite large given TIAA's inception of receiving contributions. Mr. Iden said June 2012 was the inception, and this also includes outside assets as well as 401(a). Mr. Iden said \$20,000 is the average balance.

Mr. Maguire asked what funds can be rolled over into the 401(a), which Mr. Iden said accounts such as 401(k) and 403(b) which is advantageous in lowering one's average expense ratio.

Treasurer Magaziner thanked Messrs. Stais, Iden and DiCroce for their presentations.

#### **IV. Executive Director's Report**

Director Karpinski apprised the Board that they were in possession of a corrected version of the September 2017 MERS post-retirement report which inadvertently had one page omitted; July and August 2017 Pension Application Reports; two Disability Subcommittee Reports dated August 10, 2017 and September 8, 2017, and the FY 19 Budget Presentation, relative reports of Expense Budget and the Budget's Personnel Supplement.

Director Karpinski apprised the Board of the new consent agenda for the Disability Subcommittee. The Director noted that the Disability Subcommittee Charter provides that if any member has been denied or was previously denied and is overturned, Board members must receive both the findings of fact and any hearing transcripts (if applicable). He explained that at the Board's monthly meetings, a listing of the approvals and/or postponements of applications will be presented to the Board on the consent agenda for a vote and the denials from the previous month's listing will be provided for a vote as well. Director Karpinski said the denials to be voted on will always be from the prior month due to the timing required to receive the transcripts and finding of fact.

Director Karpinski then updated the Board on the revised "*Report of Contributions*" delinquency report for MERS. The Director said the Foster Police, Union Fire District (NC) and Town of North Providence are now current. The remaining agencies are still outstanding, and they will be contacted the end of the week to have the data posted. Consistent with procedure, Board Counsel Robinson will send an official notice if no payment is made.

Mr. Dion asked about the Town of Warren being 6 payments past due as well as Lincoln Rescue, 5 payments past due. He also asked about periods past due on the Coventry Fire District. The Director said that matter is in litigation, and ERSRI is working with the District to collect the outstanding dollars. Mr. Saul said they are current now and the outstanding balance is being paid over a 12-month period. Mr. Saul said the Town of Warren sent out a payment which should be forthcoming to ERSRI. Mr. Dion then asked about the East Greenwich Fire District, which Mr. Saul said is a separate reporting even though it is merged in with the town.

Mr. Dion said again late contribution payments is unacceptable. Director Karpinski again said the system may withhold state aid but in many cases, there is none. Mr. Dion asked if the system could look at legislation to charge interest. The Treasurer said he will consider such legislation.

Mr. Boudreau asked about the 2017 COLA for Teachers and their retiring in June noting that all June Teacher retirees should have a specific date of termination based on their last day and not an aggregate date of termination. Mr. Boudreau said the matter to consider is the loss of pension payments between the teachers last day and July 1. He suggested this matter be remanded to the Governance and Members Services Subcommittees. Director Karpinski said he would put the matter on the agendas.

The second matter Mr. Boudreau addressed was a matter of the per diem substitutes in some districts who have the belief that RIGL 16-16-24 *Substitute teaching and*

*employment after retirement (90/180 law)* is not applicable since they were hired by a third party. Director Karpinski said that he and his legal staff have been working on this matter and are meeting with RIASBO this Friday to get further clarification of their position. He said he would again discuss the policy created in 2001 by the Board which is that you cannot do as a corporation what you cannot do as an individual. He said he would update the Board on his findings.

### **Consideration and Potential Approval of the FY 19 Retirement Administration and Investment Expense Budget**

Director Karpinski introduced Zachary J. Saul, Chief Financial Officer, who presented the FY 19 budget.

Mr. Saul said the Retirement System's budget cap is dictated in statute and explained its calculation subject to RIGL 36-8-10.1. Since the Retirement System is a restricted receipt account, Rhode Island General Law (RIGL) §36-8-10.1 defines how the State's budget cap is calculated as 17.5 basis points of the average total investments before lending activities as reported in the annual report of the auditor general for the next preceding five fiscal years. He said the budget cap becomes \$13,739,756 for FY 19, and the presentation today will be for a \$11.4 million budget, thus under the statutory cap. He noted that at the request of the Administration Subcommittee, included is a graph showing what the budget to actual included with the budget cap is for each fiscal year.

Mr. Dion confirmed that the system expenditures are always below the cap, and questioned if the cap is too high. Ms. Reback felt that the System's spending may not be sufficient given services provided. Treasurer Magaziner said unexpected costs such as the legal costs during the pension reform, can arise and contingencies are needed. Mr. Saul said if we do have a series of good years the budget cap will rise but that does not mean the spending needs to increase with it.

Mr. Dion asked if the draw of funds to pay expenses is monthly and is it the actual and not the budget to which Mr. Saul said yes.

Mr. Saul discussed the *Salaries and Benefits* which are projected by Treasury and based on preliminary rates. He said proposed salaries and wages expense is \$3,640,731. In FY 19 he said we expect to be fully staffed and in 2018's budget ERSRI hired two retirement counselors and one data analyst as a supplemental request. Overtime expense is higher than in the past as the system is considering extended office hours of two counselors with 8 hours a week adding a \$45,000 increase. Mr. Dion asked about the ratio of benefits to salaries and if that has been increasing, and Mr. Saul said yes and noted that retirement and healthcare would be the largest increases driving that. Mr. Dion asked if there would be any new positions for 2019 which Mr. Saul said he did not anticipate any.

Mr. Saul then highlighted the primary budget items in his presentation.

Chairman Mullaney apprised the Board that the Administration Subcommittee met on the September 6<sup>th</sup> and questions were raised as to the allocation of some of the staff from other parts of Treasury, and said the staff is seeking to collect historical information. He did note that this allocation has lessened over time. Mr. Mullaney noted that what is budgeted and what is spent varies, but as mentioned by Treasurer Magaziner, expense needs may arise thus needing adequate funds. Mr. Mullaney apprised the Board that the Subcommittee did approve the FY 19 budget as presented.

On a motion by Thomas A. Mullaney and seconded by Marcia A. Reback, it was unanimously

**VOTED: To accept the recommendation of the Administration, Audit, Risk and Compliance Subcommittee and approve the FY 19 budget of \$11,374,197 as presented.**

### **System Security Update**

Attorney Robinson then suggested that a motion would be in order for the Board to convene in Executive Session to discuss the System Security Update to the extent the matter involves security issues including but not limited to the deployment of security personnel and devices involving the Retirement Board pursuant to Rhode Island General Laws section §42-46-5 (a)(3).

Consistent with Rhode Island General Laws section §42-46-5 (a)(3), a motion was made by John P. Maguire and seconded by Roger P. Boudreau to convene the Board in Executive Session pursuant to Rhode Island General Law section §42-46-5 (a)(3) to discuss the matter on the agenda namely, *System Security Update*.

A roll call vote was taken to enter Executive Session, and the following members were present and voted Yea: General Treasurer Seth Magaziner; Vice Chair William B. Finelli; Roger P. Boudreau; Mark A. Carruolo; Brian M. Daniels; Michael DiBiase; Paul L. Dion, Ph.D.; Thomas M. Lambert; John P. Maguire; Thomas A. Mullaney; Claire M. Newell; Marcia B. Reback; Jean Rondeau and Dr. Laura Shawhughes. It was unanimously

**VOTED: To convene the Board into Executive Session pursuant to Rhode Island General Laws section §42-46-5 (a)(3) to discuss the security system update to the extent the matter involves security issues included but not limited to the deployment of security personnel and devices involving the Retirement System.**

### **[Executive Session]**

The Board thereafter convened in executive session.

### **[Return to Open Session]**

Upon returning to open session, Board Counsel Michael P. Robinson noted for the record that two unanimous votes had been taken in Executive Session.

The first motion was made to seal the executive session minutes by Roger P. Boudreau and seconded by Claire Newell pursuant to R.I.G.L. §42-46-4(b) and §42-46-5(a)(3), to the extent that the disclosure of the contents of the discussion could jeopardize the System's ongoing investigation into System security.

A roll call vote was taken to seal the minutes, and the following members were present and voted Yea: General Treasurer Seth Magaziner; Vice Chair William B. Finelli; Roger P. Boudreau; Mark A. Carruolo; Brian M. Daniels; Michael DiBiase; Paul L. Dion, Ph.D.; Thomas M. Lambert; John P. Maguire; Thomas A. Mullaney; Claire M. Newell; Marcia B. Reback; Jean Rondeau and Dr. Laura Shawhughes. It was then unanimously

**VOTED: To seal the executive session minutes pursuant to R.I.G.L. §42-46-4(b) and §42-46-5(a)(3), to the extent that the disclosure of the contents of the discussion could jeopardize the System's ongoing investigation into System security.**

A second motion was made by Marcia A. Reback and seconded by Thomas A. Mullaney to exit executive session and return to open session and it was unanimously

**VOTED: To exit executive session and return to open session.**

## VI. Legal Counsel Report

Attorney Robinson updated the Board on 3 cases. The first was regarding *Peter Ferraro vs. ERSRI*, where Judge Rodgers affirmed the Board's decision to deny Mr. Ferraro's application for an accidental disability pension. The second was by Judge Licht regarding *Emile E. Ziadeh v. ERSRI*, where he also affirmed the Board's decision to deny Mr. Ziadeh's application for an accidental disability pension. Lastly, Attorney Robinson updated the Board on the matter of *Kevin Lang v. ERSRI*. Attorney Robinson said that following an adverse decision from the Workers' Compensation Court Appellate Division, a petition for writ of certiorari was filed with the Supreme Court and remains pending.

**I. MATTERS WITH PROCEDURAL OR SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES**

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**John R. Grasso v. Gina M. Raimondo, et al.**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.: PC 2013-3121**

**Change.** Plaintiff is a disability retiree who brought this action against the Retirement System, the General Treasurer in her individual and official capacities, and the Executive Director in his individual and official capacities, seeking damages, and a determination that the Retirement System cannot require him to undergo an annual medical examination, or make adjustments to his disability allowance based on earned income. In a simultaneous administrative proceeding, on September 10, 2014 the Retirement Board affirmed the Hearing Officer's decision upholding the administrative actions of the Executive Director. On October 8, 2014, Mr. Grasso appealed the Board's decision to the Superior Court, and by agreement of the parties the City of Cranston intervened in the action. On November 5, 2015, the Superior Court issued a declaratory judgment that the System cannot require Mr. Grasso to undergo annual medical examinations, or adjust his pension based on outside earnings. The System has filed a Notice of Appeal, and a Petition for Issuance of a Writ of Certiorari with the Rhode Island Supreme Court. The Rhode Island Supreme Court has granted certiorari, and assigned the matter for full briefing. **Oral arguments took place before the Supreme Court on October 3, 2017.**

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**Emile E. Ziadeh v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island Board.**

**Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC 2016-4629**

**Change.** Plaintiff, a former state employee, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension. The parties are in the process of briefing the issues on appeal. On August 28, 2017, Judge Licht issued a decision affirming the Retirement Board's decision, and upholding the denial of Mr. Ziadeh's application for an accidental disability pension. **An order and judgment affirming the Retirement Board have entered.**

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**Mitchell Adams, Frank Andre, Eric Bazzle, Stephen Bishop, James Bomba, Gerald Capaldi, Robert Cardin, Anthony Ceprano, David DiOrio, James P. Grande, Sr., Robert Morrissey, Douglas Randall, Anthony Rossi, Kenneth Scandariato, David Vartian, John Wheeler, and Andrew Zarlenga v. The Town of North Providence, by and through its Director of Public Safety and Mayor, Charles Lombardi, and the Employees' Retirement**

**System of Rhode Island, By and through its Executive Director, Frank Karpinski**

**Providence County Superior Court; CA No. PC 2017-1956**

**Change.** Plaintiffs are retired members of the North Providence Fire Department, and seek damages and a declaratory judgment based on the contention that their required contributions were erroneously calculated. Plaintiffs seek an order preventing ERSRI from adjusting their pension benefits based on incorrect contributions. **ERSRI and its Executive Director have filed a motion to dismiss the Complaint.**

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**Retirement Board v. Ambulai Sheku**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.**

**Change.** This is an action to revoke or reduce Mr. Sheku's pension pursuant to the Public Employee Pension Revocation and Reduction Act. Mr. Sheku, a former employee of the Rhode Island Department of Labor and Training, pled guilty to charges of conspiracy to commit mail fraud, theft of government funds, and accessing a protected computer to commit fraud, all in connection with his public employment. **Mr. Sheku has been defaulted for failure to respond to the complaint.**

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**Linda Resnick v. Retirement Board of the Employees Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC-2017-1008**

**Change.** Plaintiff challenges the Retirement Board's decision to deny her request for attorneys' fees pursuant to the Equal Access to Justice for Small Businesses and Individuals Act, in connection with her administrative appeal of a Retirement Board decision related to certain post-retirement employment. The matter has been fully briefed and assigned to Judge Procaccini for decision. **On September 21, 2017, the Superior Court (Procaccini, J.) issued a decision upholding the Retirement Board's denial of Plaintiff's request for attorneys' fees pursuant to the Equal Access to Justice for Small Businesses and Individuals Act.**

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## **II. MATTERS WITH NO PROCEDURAL OR SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES**

**Peter Ferraro v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Washington County Superior Court CA No. 12-0674**

No change. Plaintiff, a Westerly school teacher, appeals the denial of his application for an ordinary disability pension. The Retirement System has filed an Answer and the Designation of

Record of Administrative Appeal with the Court. The matter has been fully briefed. On August 3, 2017, Judge Rodgers issued a decision affirming the Retirement Board's position, and upholding the denial of Mr. Ferraro's application for an accidental disability pension.

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**Wayne Cushman v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island and the City of Cranston**

**Providence County Superior Court; PC2017-1727**

No change. Plaintiff, a Cranston police officer, is challenging a decision of the Retirement Board to deny his application for an accidental disability pension. ERSRI has filed an Answer and the Designation of Record with the Court.

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**Kevin Lang v. ERSRI; Workers' Compensation Court; WCC No. 201504163**

No change. Kevin Lang, a Cranston firefighter, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension pursuant to R.I.G.L. §45-21.2-9. A pre-trial conference took place on October 28, 2015, at which time the Court denied Mr. Lang's petition for benefits. Mr. Lang thereafter claimed a trial with regard to this decision. On September 9, 2016, the Court issued a decree and decision overturning the Retirement Board, and awarding accidental disability benefits to Mr. Lang, and a counsel fee to his attorney. The Retirement Board has filed a notice of appeal. Oral argument took place before the appellate division of the Workers' Compensation Court on April 5, 2017. On July 21, 2017, the Workers' Compensation Court Appellate Division issued a decision affirming the trial court, and awarding Mr. Lang an accidental disability pension. ERSRI has filed a petition for a writ of certiorari with the Rhode Island Supreme Court.

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**Timothy Koback v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Workers' Compensation Court; No. 201607082**

No change. Timothy Koback, a Woonsocket firefighter, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension pursuant to R.I.G.L. §45-21.2-9 to the Workers' Compensation Court. ERSRI has filed the designation of record with the court. The Woonsocket Human Resources Director has been deposed, and the matter has been scheduled for a status conference on May 23, 2017. The applicant's initial petition for benefits was denied, and a claim for trial taken. Trial was conducted on August 2, 2017, at which Mr. Koback testified. A follow-up hearing is scheduled for October 4, 2017 at 10 AM.

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**Linda Acciardo v. Employee's Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 10-2822**

No change. This action arises out of the denial by the Retirement Board of Ms. Acciardo's application for accidental disability retirement. Ms. Acciardo was a Chief Inspector for the R.I. Department of Health. An Answer was filed on May 19, 2010. The Designation of Record of

Administrative Appeal was filed on June 17, 2010. On August 24, 2012, Mr. Justice Van Couyghen remanded the matter to the Retirement Board for further proceedings. On July 9, 2014, the Retirement Board denied Ms. Acciardo's application. On July 28, 2014, Ms. Acciardo filed a second appeal to the Superior Court. On February 17, 2017, the Court (Van Couyghen, J.) issued a decision affirming the Retirement Board's decision. Ms. Acciardo has filed a motion to reconsider. Judge Van Couyghen issued an Order denying the motion to reconsider. Ms. Acciardo filed a petition for issuance of a writ of certiorari seeking review by the Rhode Island Supreme Court, and ERSRI has filed an opposition.

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**Damon Borrelli v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island (ERSRI).**

**Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC-2016-2817**

No change. Plaintiff, a South Kingstown Police Officer, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension. ERSRI has filed an Answer to Mr. Borelli's First Amended Complaint, and the Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal with the court. The Town of South Kingstown filed a motion to intervene in the action, which motion was granted. The parties are in the process of briefing the issues.

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**Robert Perfetto v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Providence County Superior Court; PC2017-1767**

No change. Plaintiff, a former employee of the State of Rhode Island, challenges the Retirement System's decision not to include a lump sum payment he had received in settlement of a lawsuit, in calculating his retirement benefits. Service has been effectuated. The Retirement System has filed an Answer and the Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal with the Court.

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**Sandra Tiernan v. Frank Caprio *et al.***

**Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 09-7242**

No change. This declaratory judgment action arises out of the setoff of workers compensation benefits from disability pension benefits. A Stipulation was filed on January 27, 2010 in the administrative appeal prematurely filed with the Superior Court, postponing the filing of an Answer and the Administrative Record pending the conclusion of the administrative proceedings. The Retirement Board has affirmed the administrative actions taken by the Executive Director. Ms. Tiernan filed a motion to amend her complaint to include a claim based on an administrative appeal under the Administrative Procedures Act. The motion to amend was granted, and the Retirement Board filed an answer to the amended complaint. Ms. Tiernan subsequently was allowed to amend her complaint a second time, to include a claim based on estoppel. The issues have been fully briefed, and assigned to Ms. Justice Keough for decision.

**Retirement Board v. Fred Randall**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC15-0203**

No change. This is an action to revoke or reduce Mr. Randall's pension pursuant to the Public Employee Pension Revocation and Reduction Act. Mr. Randall, a former employee of the University of Rhode Island, pled *nolo contendere* to a charge of conversion by a state employee. A hearing wherein Mr. Randall was required to appear and show cause why his pension benefits should not be suspended pending adjudication of the merits of the action took place on March 2, 2014. The Court determined that cause was not shown by Mr. Randall, and ordered that his pension benefits be immediately suspended pending adjudication of the action on the merits. An evidentiary hearing was conducted on July 7, 2016 at 2:00 PM. The court has issued a decision revoking Mr. Randall's pension in full, and awarding Mrs. Randall \$350.00 per month from the date of trial through December 31, 2016, and \$1,667.00 per month from January 1, 2017 until December 31, 2026 as an innocent spouse, conditioned upon her paying said sums over to URI to satisfy Mr. Randall's restitution payments. The court ruled that thereafter, once the restitution obligations have been satisfied, she should receive \$500.00 per month.

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**Margaret Provoyeur v. Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island.**

**Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC 2015-2609**

No change. Plaintiff, a Providence school teacher, appeals the denial of her application for an accidental disability pension. On August 24, 2016, Plaintiff filed a motion to remand the matter to the Disability Subcommittee for the consideration of additional evidence. ERSRI filed an objection, and on October 28, 2016, the Superior Court denied the motion to remand.

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**The Retirement Board of the Municipal Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island v. Coventry Fire District, By and Through Frank Palin, John D'Onofrio, Brenda Rapose, and John Cook, in their Capacities as Board Members and Inhabitants of the District, Robert Catalfamo, in his Capacity as Tax Assessor/Collector of the District, and David Krekorian, in his Capacity as Treasurer of the District.**

**Kent County Superior Court; C.A. No. KC2015-1099**

No change. Plaintiff brings this action seeking to collect unpaid employer and employee contributions to MERS. Defendant has not answered the case, but is seeking verification of the amount of the indebtedness.

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**Jeanne Rossi v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 09-2607**

No change. This action arises out of the denial by the Retirement System of Ms. Rossi's application for attorney's fees pursuant to the Equal Access to Justice Act, related to the earlier denial of her application for an accidental disability pension. The Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal has been filed with the Court. The matter has been fully briefed and assigned to Mr. Justice Rubine for decision.

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**Jane Robinson v. Frank J. Karpinski in his capacity as Executive Director of the Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 09-7019**

No change. This action arises out of the denial by the Retirement System of Ms. Robinson's request to purchase service credit for time when she left teaching for maternity reasons. An Answer was filed. The Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal was filed on April 14, 2010. This matter has been fully briefed and assigned to Ms. Justice Hurst for decision.

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**Nancy Langlois v. Frank T. Caprio**

**Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 10-0909**

No change. This action arises out of the denial by the Retirement Board of Ms. Langlois's application to receive service credit for the time she worked reduced hours after she returned from maternity leave. An Answer and the Designation of the Administrative Record have been filed. On April 26, 2012, Mr. Justice Procaccini remanded the case to the Retirement Board for further proceedings. The matter was referred to the Hearing Officer for further consideration consistent with the April 26, 2012 decision. On October 24, 2012, the Hearing Officer issued a decision again affirming the administrative decision to deny Ms. Langlois's application to receive service credit. On December 12, 2012, the Retirement Board again voted to deny Ms. Langlois's request to obtain service credit. On January 21, 2013, Ms. Langlois filed a First Amended Complaint. The Retirement System's Answer and Amended Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal were filed on January 25, 2013.

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**Jennifer Leyden v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Providence County Superior Court CA No. 2012-1867**

No change. This Administrative Appeal arises from Jennifer Leyden's claims that ERSRI wrongfully denied her application for an accidental disability pension. Ms. Leyden was a teacher for the Providence Public School System. The Retirement System's Answer was filed on June 4, 2012. The Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal was filed on June 5, 2012. The

matter was fully briefed and assigned to Mr. Justice Lanphear for decision. On June 5, 2013, Judge Lanphear issued a decision remanding the matter to the Retirement Board for further proceedings. On July 17, 2013, ERSRI filed a petition for issuance of a writ of certiorari with the Rhode Island Supreme Court. On June 11, 2014, the Rhode Island Supreme Court issued an order denying the petition for certiorari as a final judgment has not yet entered. Ms. Leyden filed a motion with the Superior Court attempting to restrict the system's ability to obtain an additional independent medical examination. On October 17, 2014, the Superior Court denied Ms. Leyden's motion.

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**Michael T. Brady v. Gina M. Raimondo, et al.**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.: PC 2013-5592**

No change. Plaintiff is a disability retiree who brought this action against the Retirement System, the General Treasurer in her individual and official capacities, and the Executive Director in his individual and official capacities, seeking, *inter alia*, damages, and a determination that the Retirement System cannot make adjustments to his disability allowance based on earned income. The parties have stipulated that the Superior Court action will be held in abeyance while Plaintiff pursues administrative remedies.

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**Albert DelMastro, Jr. v. Employee's Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC14-1850**

No change. Plaintiff, an electrician with the Community College of Rhode Island, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension. The Retirement System has filed an Answer and the Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal with the Court.

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**Retirement Board v. Rachel Arruda**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC14-6174**

No change. This is an action to revoke or reduce Ms. Arruda's pension pursuant to the Public Employee Pension Revocation and Reduction Act. Ms. Arruda, a former employee of the City of Woonsocket, pled *nolo contendere* to a felony charge related to conversion of funds in connection with her municipal employment. At a hearing on January 29, 2015, Arruda stipulated to the suspension of her pension pending adjudication of the action.

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**The Retirement Board of the Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island  
v. Gerard M. Martineau**

**Providence County Superior Court; C.A. No. PC 15-1268**

No change. This is an action to revoke or reduce Mr. Martineau's pension pursuant to the Public Employee Pension Revocation and Reduction Act. Mr. Martineau, a former elected official of the State of Rhode Island, pled *nolo contendere* to charges of Honest Services Mail Fraud in connection with his public employment. Mr. Martineau was served with the Complaint on April 2, 2015. Mr. Martineau has agreed to voluntarily relinquish any entitlement to a pension or other benefit he might otherwise have been entitled to, and documents necessary to obtain court approval of revocation of his pension have been sent to him for review.

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**Benjamin Zanni v. Town of Johnston and ERSRI**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC-2015-4245**

No change. Plaintiff brought suit against the Town of Johnston and ERSRI (as an "interested party"), challenging the City's decision to deny him medical benefits pursuant to ordinance, based on his prior criminal conviction for conduct in connection with his public employment. The matter was initially removed by the City to federal court, and was then remanded to the superior court. ERSRI has filed an Answer to the Complaint.

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**Robert E. Falvey v. Seth Magaziner, et al.**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.: PC 2016-0232**

No change. Plaintiff is a disability retiree who brought this action against the Retirement Board, the General Treasurer in his capacity as chair of the Board, the Executive Director, and the State of Rhode Island, seeking, *inter alia*, damages, and a determination that the Retirement System cannot make adjustments to his disability allowance based on earned income. The parties have stipulated that no Answer or other response shall be required to be filed until 30 days after Plaintiff's counsel states in writing that an Answer or other response is being requested.

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**Benita Fernandez v. Employee's Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC2015-5489**

No change. Plaintiff, a Social Caseworker II with DCYF, appeals the denial of her application for an accidental disability pension. The Retirement System has filed an Answer and the Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal with the Court.

**Anne Marcaccio v. Central Falls Board of Trustees, and its Members, Anna Cano Morales, Sonia Grace, Hugo Figueroa, Stephanie Gonzalez, Diosa Martinez, Ana Cecilia Rosado, and Ronald Pitt, the North Smithfield School Committee, and its Members, Merredythe Nadeau, Arthur Bassett, Michael Clifford, William J. O'Connell, Liane M. Jalette, James J. Lombardi, III, and John E. Raymond and the Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island, by and through the General Treasurer, Seth Magaziner.**

**Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC 16-1210**

No change. Plaintiff has brought this declaratory judgment action, with the stated intention of obtaining records from her former employers for use in connection with administrative proceedings at ERSRI related to the calculation of service credit, and her corresponding eligibility for a service pension. ERSRI has filed an answer to the complaint.

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**Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island v. Thomas McSoley, Marlene A. Palumbo, and Michael E. McSoley.**

**Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC2016-1144**

No change. ERSRI brought suit to recover monies overpaid to a direct deposit account of Thomas McSoley, following his death in 2011. The defendants are believed to be joint account holders with the decedent. ERSRI effectuated service of process, and sought an injunction preventing the defendants from accessing or withdrawing the funds. On March 18, 2016, the parties entered into a Consent Order that restrains the defendants from accessing, withdrawing, encumbering, or otherwise spending or disposing of the funds on account until further order of the Court.

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**Alfred Benjamin v. Seth Magaziner, et al.**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.: PC 2016-4467**

No change. Plaintiff is a disability retiree who brought this action against the Retirement Board, the General Treasurer in his capacity as chair of the Board, the Executive Director, and the State of Rhode Island, seeking, *inter alia*, damages, and a determination that the Retirement System cannot make adjustments to his disability allowance based on earned income. 

The Monthly Meeting of the State Investment Commission (SIC) was called to order at 9:01, Wednesday, August 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2017 in Room 205, State House.

## **I. Roll Call of Members**

The following members were present: Mr. Thomas Fay, Ms. Marie Langlois, Ms. Marcia Reback, Ms. Karen Hammond, Ms. Sylvia Maxfield, Mr. Thomas Mullaney, and Treasurer Seth Magaziner.

The following members were absent: Mr. Michael Costello, Mr. Robert Benson, Mr. Frank Karpinski

Also in attendance: Mr. Tom Lynch, Cliffwater; Mr. John Burns, Pension Consulting Alliance (PCA); Ms. Nancy Karpf, Davidson Kempner; Mr. Larry Brown and Mr. David Iden, TIAA; Mr. Gregory Miller, Voya; Ms. Ellen Savary and Andrew Brandt, Fidelity; Ms. Kimberly Shockley, Associate Director of College and Retirement Savings Plan; Mr. Alec Stais, Chief Investment Officer, Ms. Sally Dowling, Adler, Pollock & Sheehan, legal counsel; and other members of the Treasurer's staff.

Treasurer Magaziner called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m.

## **II. Approval of Minutes**

On a motion by Mr. Fay and seconded by Ms. Reback it was unanimously **VOTED: to approve the draft minutes of the July 10th, 2017 meeting of the State Investment Commission.**

## **III. Review and Consideration of the Inflation Protection IPS**

Treasurer Magaziner prefaced the conversation with the fact that the Investment Policy Statements (IPS) for the various portfolio segments continue to be updated to reflect the new asset allocation adopted last year and this is the last segment IPS to be voted on.

Mr. Burns summarized the Inflation Protection portfolio and its purpose. He informed the board that the Inflation Protection Class will be 8% of the portfolio under the new asset allocation. He touched on types of inflation and highlighted the objectives and reasons for having the inflation protection class. He concluded by describing the different components of the class and diversification benefits of the Inflation Protection Class.

The Board reviewed the Inflation Protection Class Investment Policy Statement.

The Board asked questions.

On a motion by Mr. Fay and seconded by Ms. Langlois, it was unanimously **VOTED: to approve the Inflation Protection Class Investment Policy Statement**

#### **IV. Private Credit Overview**

Mr. Lynch gave a summary of the Private Credit segment which is a component of the Income Class. He provided the board with brief descriptions of the different types of credit and their role in the overall portfolio. He touched on the portfolio's current Private Credit investments including each fund's performance since inception.

The Board asked questions.

#### **V. Opportunistic Credit Investment Recommendation, Davidson Kempner**

Mr. Lynch introduced Ms. Karpf and the strategy she would present as an opportunistic credit fund with attractive long-run expected returns (similar to equities).

Ms. Karpf provided an overview on the history and structure of Davidson Kempner, noting that ERSRI is currently invested in their multi-strategy absolute return fund. She reported that the firm is fully owned by their senior professionals who have also committed substantial investments to their own funds. She commented on their investment process, stating they are fundamental, bottom-up investors and they have an emphasis on risk management and capital preservation. She added that there are no specific guidelines around how much they can invest in a sector or subsector.

The Board asked questions.

Mr. Lynch informed the board this would be an Opportunistic Credit investment in the Growth bucket.

On a motion by Ms. Langlois and seconded by Ms. Reback, it was unanimously **VOTED: that the Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island make a \$50 million investment in Davidson Kempner Long-Term Distressed Opportunities Fund IV L.P. with an effective closing date of September, 1 2017, subject to legal and investment staff review and submission of required Subscription documents following the date of this resolution.**

#### **VI. Review and Consideration of the 457/401a Investment Lineup**

Treasurer Magaziner recalled the recent vote for the three 457 managers: Fidelity and Voya, who have been long-standing providers to RI; and TIAA which was recently added.

##### **Fidelity**

Ms. Savary explained the recent changes which Fidelity has added to its program including more transparency on administrative costs and increased commitments to educational sessions and client meetings, which has enabled clients to actively manage their accounts. They proposed two additions to the existing investment lineup: T. Rowe Price Stable Value and Vanguard Socially Responsible Index.

The Board asked questions.

On a motion by Ms. Langlois and seconded by Ms. Reback, it was unanimously **VOTED: to approve the additions to the investment lineup**

## **Voya**

Mr. Miller highlighted the new investment lineup and explained the transition process for plan participants. Mr. Miller also commented on the Voya Fixed Account stable value product, and showed a new brochure being sent to plan participants. The lineup contains both actively and passively managed funds, as well as ESG-based strategies.

The Board asked questions. There was discussion about the change in the structure of the Voya Fixed Account.

On a motion by Mr. Mullaney and seconded by Ms. Langlois, it was unanimously **VOTED: to approve the changes to the investment lineup**

## **TIAA**

Mr. Brown explained the progress of transitioning participants' accounts from Valic to TIAA, and highlighted TIAA's Traditional Annuities benefits versus the T. Rowe Stable Value product. Mr. Brown stated that TIAA's Annuity Product is the most comparable product to the former fixed account product offered by VALIC.

The Board asked questions.

On a motion by Ms. Reback and seconded by Mr. Mullaney, it was unanimously **VOTED: to approve the changes to the investment lineup**

## **VII. Legal Counsel Report**

There was no legal counsel report.

## **VIII. Chief Investment Officer Report**

Mr. Stais showed the new reporting formats that match the new asset allocation for the SIC Book. He gave commentary on current market conditions and noted the markets are pricing in a higher likelihood of tax reform going forward. Mr. Stais also distributed Credit Protection Class (CPC) reports created by the CPC platform manager for performance and position monitoring. Mr. Stais noted that there was a probability of adding a third systematic trend-following manager to the CPC allocation. He also asked if any board members wanted to assist the staff with the general consultant RFP during the fall.

## **IX. Treasurer's General Comments**

Treasurer Magaziner provided the board several updates. Notably, He asked the Treasury staff to prepare a report on the progress of the new asset allocation for its first anniversary of being passed.

Treasurer Magaziner told the board that staff will be reaching out to 457 plan participants to help them transition to newly available products across plan providers.

Treasurer Magaziner also noted that he had pledged to have each contract of the office go out for bid at least once during his term, which is the catalyst behind the general consultant RFP. Ms. Maxfield and Mr. Fay expressed interest in participating in the consultant RFP review process.

There being no other business to come before the board, on a motion by Mr. Fay and seconded by Ms. Langlois, the meeting adjourned at 11:43 a.m.

# Portfolio Highlights

## August 2017

On the month, the total portfolio value increased by approximately \$11.8 million. The month's \$64.2 million of positive investment performance was offset by \$52.4 million of transfers to meet pension payroll in excess of pension contributions. On a percentage basis, the portfolio increased 0.79% net of fees, beating the plan benchmark of 0.77% and the 60% global equity/40% fixed income benchmark of 0.59%.

Calendar year-to-date, the total portfolio has increased by \$474.4 million, with net gains of \$716.3 million offset by \$241.9 million in pension payments. The portfolio's 9.42% net return lagged both the strategic benchmark and 60/40 returns of 9.43% and 10.31%, respectively. Fiscal year-to-date, the total portfolio value increased by approximately \$129.3 million. The month's \$201.2 million of positive investment performance was offset by \$71.8 million of transfers to meet pension payroll in excess of pension contributions. The portfolio increased 2.50% net of fees, beating the plan benchmark of 2.44% but lagging the 60% global equity/40% fixed income benchmark of 2.45%.

Over a 3-year time frame and when comparing against a 60/40 portfolio, the ERSRI portfolio outperformed at 4.98% net of fees versus the plan benchmark of 4.84% and the 60/40 portfolio which earned 4.55%. Over a 5-year time frame, the ERSRI portfolio earned 7.79% net of fees, outperforming the plan benchmark of 7.69% and 60/40 benchmark which posted 7.21%.








**Global Public Equity - by Industry Sector**






**Cash Flow and Valuation Summary**




**Commitment by Vintage Year**




**Historical Cash Flows and Valuation**






**Commitment by Vintage Year**




**Historical Cash Flows and Valuation**






**Commitment by Vintage Year**




