



The Monthly Meeting of the Retirement Board was called to order at 9:04 a.m. Wednesday, September 14, 2016, in the 2nd Floor Conference Room, 50 Service Avenue, Warwick, RI.

I. Roll Call of Members

The following members were present at roll call: Treasurer Seth Magaziner; Vice Chair William B. Finelli; Daniel L. Beardsley; Roger P. Boudreau; Michael DiBiase; Paul L. Dion, PhD.; Thomas M. Lambert; John P. Maguire; Joanne A. Matisewski; Marianne F. Monte; Thomas A. Mullaney; Claire M. Newell; Jean Rondeau and Dr. Laura Shawhughes.

Also in attendance: Frank J. Karpinski, ERSRI Executive Director and Attorney Michael P. Robinson, Board Counsel.

Recognizing a quorum, Treasurer Magaziner called the meeting to order.

Treasurer Magaziner asked that the Board consider a change in the agenda's order to accommodate the attorneys present for disability hearings. He asked that they switch Item IV, Executive Director's Report with Item V, Administrative Decisions.

On a motion by Roger P. Boudreau and seconded by Jean Rondeau, it was unanimously **VOTED: To switch agenda item IV Executive Director's Report and Item V Administrative Decisions.**

II. Approval of Minutes

On a motion by William B. Finelli and seconded by John P. Maguire, it was unanimously **VOTED: To approve the draft regular session minutes of the July 13, 2016 meeting of the Retirement Board of the Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island.**

III. Chairperson's Report

Quarterly Update on the Investment Portfolio as of June 30, 2016 by CIO Tim Nguyen

Treasurer Magaziner apprised the Board that interim Chief Investment Officer Tim Nguyen will provide the June 30, 2016 quarterly update on investments.

Mr. Nguyen said ERSRI achieved a mix performance for the fiscal year 2016, outperforming its policy benchmark while protecting against steep investment losses

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during a challenging year for all investors. Mr. Nguyen said the SIC's portfolio returned -0.27%, outperforming the plan benchmark's -0.36% and significantly outperforming the equity markets which lost 4% in a year, but underperforming the 60/40 portfolio (60% equity/40% fixed income) of 0.33%.

Mr. Nguyen said the backdrop entering FY2016 specifically in the 3rd quarter of 2015 consisted of the following: US Oil prices fell to 6-year lows; Eurozone economic growth slowed; US 10-year note closed below 2% and Russia began airstrikes in Syria. He said all of these impacted the financial market both domestically and internationally.

Mr. Nguyen said also in the 4th quarter of 2015, the following were factors affecting the backdrop entering FY2016: The IMF downgraded global economic outlook again; oil prices dropped to 7 year lows; the Fed raising of interest rates sighting possible recovery and lastly, it was the worst year for S & P and the Dow since 2008.

Mr. Nguyen said for the 1st quarter of 2016, oil prices dropped to 12-year lows; the Bank of Japan (BOJ) introduced negative interest rates and the British pound sank to 7-year lows due to impending Brexit fears.

Mr. Nguyen said an overall fiscal year's performance looking over the 3-year and 5-year horizons, the portfolio has outperformed the 60/40 allocation of 5.49% and 4.98%, respectively.

Treasurer Magaziner asked CIO Nguyen what progress the SIC is making in the asset liability study. Mr. Nguyen said from the July 13, 2016 joint meeting with the SIC, taking the Board's feedback, they have been working diligently with their consultant Pension Consultant Alliance (PCA) to look at a new asset allocation. He said the SIC is on the second run of outputs on the portfolio.

Mr. Dion asked for an explanation relating to the objective function and constraints relating to the portfolio allocations. Mr. Nguyen mentioned one constraint is to maximize the funding ratio recognizing that a funding ratio of less than 50% is not acceptable. The second constraint relates to the issue of employer contribution, with the goal being to avoid employer contributions rising to greater than 30% of payroll.

Treasurer Magaziner said there was a constraint in the model trying to reduce the possibility of the fund going 50% or below from legislation passed in 2011 that requires a funding improvement plan. The Treasurer said the model will also try to maximize an 80% funding level in time so the COLA will occur when projected. Thirdly, the Treasurer said there is a constraint to minimize the chance of a sudden spike in contribution rate of more than a few percent in one year. The Treasurer said the SIC is studying these scenarios and hopes to have results by month end.

Treasurer Magaziner then introduced Messrs. Laurence E. Brown, Director, Investment Product & Strategy and David Iden, Relationship Manager, Institutional Relationships from TIAA-CREF Financial Services.

Mr. Iden started with a summary of data for all the plans, stating that total plan assets were \$516,133,015 as of June 30, 2016. He noted that 91% of assets are held in Vanguard Lifecycle trusts. He then provided a breakdown of participants, noting that the majority of participants (62%) are between mid-career and retirement age noting at the bottom of the page there is a breakdown of the age and gender.

Mr. Dion asked Mr. Iden if the average age changes with the overall time period of the plan. Mr. Iden said within the last two and half years, there has not been much change but will look into it further going back to 5 years' trend.

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Mr. Iden said the Defined Contribution Plan (DC Plan) which houses 99% of the assets has a total plan assets amount of \$514,246,161. He said all of the assets are in the Vanguard Lifecycle Trust. Mr. Dion asked if the default fund trust of the Vanguard Target Retirement 2010 Trust II is labeled incorrectly of its date (2010) which Mr. Iden confirmed it is a misprint which he will correct.

Mr. Iden noted the breakdown of plan assets by investment option. He said there has also been great success thus far this year in the outreach regarding the communication and education highlights of 2016.

Mr. Dion asked Mr. Iden if TIAA could provide the Board a one-on-one session simulation to allow the Board to ascertain what occurs and what tools are used. Treasurer Magaziner said that this can be a worthwhile opportunity and if the Member Services Committee is implemented as the Governance study suggests, it would be an opportunity for them to review.

Mr. Iden provided the Board the breakdown of statistics of workshops historically with individual sessions with financial consulting groups and with wealth management groups of TIAA's history of in-person interactions with plan participants.

Next Mr. Brown provided an investment summary. He referred to the net returns under recent returns (YTD) as of end of July 2016 and how various investment options have compared to their peers measured by Morningstar.

Mr. Brown said the fee arrangement for the Vanguard Target Retirement Trust is going from 8 to 7 basis points. He then said the Vanguard Midcap Index met the \$5 million hurdle moving from 8 to 7 basis points. He also said the YTD returns range from 1% in the Stable Value down to 8.3% in the Van Midcap Index. He reminded the Board there are 11 options offered to participants.

Mr. Brown said the returns are a bit higher on the Vanguard Small Cap Index fund and in the emerging markets. He noted emerging markets have not done well in the past so this spike in its rate of return is a positive mention.

In summary, Mr. Brown said returns are on line with the benchmark with TIAA offering 10 options noting they are conservative investments.

Treasurer Magaziner thanked Messrs. Nguyen, Iden and Brown for their presentations.

IV. Administrative Decisions

Disability Appeal – Emile E. Ziadeh vs. ERSRI

Included in Board Members' Books, under separate cover, were the findings of fact as concluded by the Disability Subcommittee, transcripts from the appeal to the subcommittee following reconsideration, medical and supporting information in the matter of *Emile E. Ziadeh vs. ERSRI*. Attorney Robinson asked if consistent with Regulation Number 9, *Rules pertaining to the application to receive an Ordinary or Accidental Disability Pension*, there were any written briefs, legal memoranda, or exceptions to the conclusions and recommendation of the Disability Subcommittee, which must have been submitted to the Executive Director not later than 10 days prior to the hearing. Director Karpinski apprised the Board there was and that such material was included in the Board members' books.

Attorney Robinson noted for the record that Mr. Ziadeh was represented by legal counsel, Attorney Frederick A. Marzilli. Attorney Robinson then said that pursuant to ERSRI's regulations, each party to the proceeding has the right to appear and to make oral arguments before the Retirement Board. Consistent with the Board's long standing policy, he apprised Mr. Ziadeh that this is not an opportunity to present new factual material or evidence to the Board, and that pursuant to ERSRI's regulations and Rhode Island case law, the Board owes deference to the Disability Subcommittee on factual determinations and questions of credibility, and will not overturn those determinations of fact or credibility unless such determinations are found to be clearly wrong. There being a stenographer present, Attorney Robinson then provided a synopsis of the matter.

At the conclusion of the presentations, a motion was made by Roger P. Boudreau and seconded by Michael DiBiase to uphold the decision and recommendation of the Disability Subcommittee denying the accidental disability application including the rejection of the applicant's request for additional IME's, and to affirm and adopt the Subcommittee's findings of fact. The following voted Yea: General Treasurer Seth Magaziner; Vice Chair William B. Finelli; Daniel L. Beardsley; Roger P. Boudreau; Michael DiBiase; Paul L. Dion, PhD.; Thomas M. Lambert; John P. Maguire; Joanne A. Matisewski; Marianne F. Monte; Thomas A. Mullaney; Claire M. Newell; Jean Rondeau and Dr. Laura Shawhughes.

There being 14 votes cast, 14 voted in the affirmative. Consistent with Rhode Island General Laws §36-8-6, *Votes of the Board -- Record of Proceedings*, there being a majority vote of the members present and voting at which a quorum is present, it was:

Ziadeh vs. ERSRI.

Disability Appeal – Michelle Desrosiers vs. ERSRI

Included in Board Members' Books, under separate cover, were the Findings of Fact as concluded by the Disability Subcommittee, transcripts from the appeal to the subcommittee following reconsideration, medical and supporting information in the matter of *Michelle Desrosiers vs. ERSRI*. Attorney Robinson asked if consistent with Regulation Number 9, *Rules pertaining to the application to receive an Ordinary or Accidental Disability Pension*, there were any written briefs, legal memoranda, or exceptions to the conclusions and recommendation of the Disability Subcommittee, which must have been submitted to the Executive Director not later than 10 days prior to the hearing. Director Karpinski apprised the Board there was and that such material was included in the Board members' books.

Attorney Robinson noted for the record that Ms. Desrosiers was represented by legal counsel, Attorney Stephen P. Maguire. Attorney Robinson then said that pursuant to ERSRI's regulations, each party to the proceeding has the right to appear and to make oral arguments before the Retirement Board. Consistent with the Board's long standing policy, he apprised Ms. Desrosiers that this is not an opportunity to present new factual material or evidence to the Board, and that pursuant to ERSRI's regulations and Rhode Island case law, the Board owes deference to the Disability Subcommittee on factual

determinations and questions of credibility, and will not overturn those determinations of fact or credibility unless such determinations are found to be clearly wrong. There being a stenographer present, Attorney Robinson then provided a synopsis of the matter.

At the conclusion of the presentations, a motion was made by Jean Rondeau and seconded by Michael DiBiase to uphold the decision and recommendation of the Disability Subcommittee denying the accidental disability application, and to affirm and adopt the Subcommittee's findings of fact and conclusions in the matter of *Michelle Desrosiers vs. ERSRI*. There being 14 votes cast, 14 voted in the affirmative. Consistent with Rhode Island General Laws §36-8-6, *Votes of the Board -- Record of Proceedings*, there being a majority vote of the members present and voting at which a quorum is present, it was:

VOTED: To uphold the decision and recommendation of the Disability Subcommittee denying the accidental disability application, and to affirm and adopt the Subcommittee's findings of fact and conclusions in the matter of Michelle Desrosiers vs. ERSRI.

V. Executive Director's Report

Director Karpinski apprised the Board that they were in possession of the September 2016 *Pension Application Report* and the Disability Subcommittee Reports dated August 4, 2016 and September 9, 2016.

• Consideration of Funston Advisory Services Board Governance Recommendations

Director Karpinski then provided the Board with a presentation on the implementation of Funston Advisory Services LLC (FAS) proposed Governance model for ERSRI.

Director Karpinski said the project purpose was to identify ways to improve the effectiveness of the ERSRI Board and its Committees. FAS noted that the current committees have very limited scope and mission, and recommended the Board consider an alternative committee structure.

Director Karpinski said FAS provided some key considerations for improvements indicating that with the current committee structure, the Board spends too much time on disability appeals thus limiting available time for big-picture strategic issues. FAS also recommended a stronger committee structure with committees diving deep on operational issues, and the full board focusing on big picture strategy.

Director Karpinski discussed a Retirement System Enterprise Process Map (EPM), provided by FAS, that gives the Board a map of high level responsibilities of the Board (i.e., Govern the System; provide member services; provide employer services; provide pension benefits and administer the System). The Director said the EPM helps the Board be more of a policymaking body while the subcommittees work with more detailed matters.

Mr. Maguire stated that since the General Assembly ultimately controls the ERSRI budget, there may be constraints on costs for additional staffing, technology etc. if deemed appropriate by the Board staff as part of their analysis in the committees.

Treasurer Magaziner said that once the Board gets feedback from the committees and staff as a more strategic planning process, they, as a Board, can make better strategic decisions of what is to be requested to the legislature.

Director Karpinski said FAS recommended, as a key consideration for improvement, that the full Board should no longer be directly involved in the disability appeals process. This consideration would allow the Board more time to focus on big-picture strategic issues. He said members still will be afforded the opportunity to be heard twice by the subcommittee and an opportunity for a judicial appeal. He noted that over the past 5 years, the full board has overturned subcommittee decisions less than 10% of the time.

Mr. Beardsley asked if he could get an idea of how many disabilities are presented to the subcommittee, and Treasurer Magaziner said of those 15 members presented monthly to the subcommittee roughly one or two a month reach the Board in a given year. The Treasurer also said a member has two opportunities with the subcommittee, then to the full Board and then to Superior of Workers Compensation Court. The Director also said removing full board appeals will help streamline the process for members and save the system on legal and operational costs.

Mr. Beardsley added that there are too many tangents in adjudicating applications due to various court decisions that are sometimes contrary to the subcommittee's analysis.

Mr. Finelli affirmed that the Disability Subcommittee gives recommendations to the full Board and feels that since the subcommittees have the ability to choose a "designee appointee", if the full Board appeal is removed, an aggrieved member may not have had the opportunity to have "Board members" adjudicate their application. Director Karpinski said that the designee appointee is only stated in an ERSRI regulation, not statute, and the Board could revise that regulation should they consider removing the full Board appeal.

Mr. Rondeau commended the subcommittee for their efforts and said as Board Counsel Robinson noted previously, it owes deference to the disability subcommittee. He believed it very rare that the Board overturns the recommendation of the subcommittee.

Mr. Boudreau agreed that focusing on the limited members aggrieved by the disability subcommittee's decision is time consuming. He felt the Board would be better served concentrating on the other matters on a given monthly agenda. He also feels that putting a heavy responsibility on the full Retirement Board does not make total sense when there is still an opportunity to have the recommendation overturned or other legal process as going to Superior Court.

Director Karpinski said some of the major implementation activities include committee structure and charter revision or development. He said there is a recommendation to review the disability process, an expanded Procurement and Audit Subcommittee to the Administration/Audit/Risk/Compliance Subcommittee which includes Finance, Organization and IT. Also he said there is a recommendation to combine the Rules and Regulations, Legislative, and Board Education Subcommittees into the Governance Subcommittee. Finally, the creation of a new subcommittee Member Services Subcommittee was recommended.

Director Karpinski said another major implementation activity would be the Executive Director goal-setting/evaluation and delegations as well as strategic planning and Board and subcommittee calendars.

Director Karpinski provided some examples of the committee structures:

Disability Subcommittee -- will continue to meet monthly to consider disability applications.

Administration Subcommittee – Review internal audit plans and procedures; review operational risk plans; review financial plans, budget and staffing; review information technology and cybersecurity plans.

Governance Subcommittee – Review and update Board policies and processes, as appropriate, and obtain Board approval; conduct initial Board self-assessment; conduct Executive Director’s succession planning; develop Board training agenda and program; review legislative program and processes.

Member Services Subcommittee – Work with staff to develop and implement a strategic plan for member communications, education and counseling

Treasurer Magaziner said the most challenging issues raised by members is the prospect getting one-on-one counseling sessions. He also said getting support on the DB and DC plans as well as 457 plans for State employees are items he would like to see in a one-stop personalized meeting with a counselor to gather all a member’s portfolio at one time.

Director Karpinski said the proposed implementation timeline would be October/November where the Board adopts committee charters, in November the committee assignments would be made and December/January the first committee meetings under new governance structure would begin.

Treasurer Magaziner offered to hear the Board’s scheduling availability options for Board meetings with FAS’s recommendations. He suggested the Board meet quarterly to focus on strategic plans. The prior 2 months the Board would meet and split into each subcommittee.

Mr. Dion asked if meeting quarterly is too much of a gap of time since pensions need to be approved, for example. He suggested bi-monthly. Treasurer Magaziner said though the Board approves pensions monthly, these pensions have already been processed. The Treasurer said if there is a pension that is ambiguous, it can and will be reviewed.

Director Karpinski said the new model would have an annual meeting calendar of the Board and Subcommittees that he would provide. The agendas for the subcommittee meetings would be based on the Boards overall strategic goals and assigned tasks, further detailed by the committee chairs.

Director Karpinski apprised the Board that these are leading practices and combined with feedback from each of the Board members. Treasurer Magaziner stated that this matter would be held until the next meeting for additional discussion and encouraged Board members to send additional ideas to Director Karpinski.

Director Karpinski then updated the Board on the revised “*Report of Contributions*” delinquency report distributed today. The Director noted that some of the teacher numbers in the estimated column are based on the last payroll which would have been in June, but he said during the summer teachers have little or no payroll so the estimates are high. The Director also noted a small portion of employers are having

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some technical difficulty posting the payroll and ERSRI is working to ensure assistance. The Director said the remaining outstanding employers (both MERS and ERS) will soon be addressed starting next month using the normal collection of funds procedure if payment of contributions is not received.

Mr. Maguire asked if the money that is taken out of a member's paycheck for the TIAA DC contribution is still being sent to TIAA. Director Karpinski said the monies for TIAA must be deposited within 5 days and referred to the TIAA report provided in the monthly Board book where no one is outstanding unless a specific matter is noted.

Mr. Dion asked if there is interest being incurred to employers if contributions are not collected. Director Karpinski said there is no provision for the Board to do so.

Director Karpinski apprised the Board there is a breakdown of multiple employers for an individual retiree working post-retirement employment. The Director also offered the Board's input if any changes are requested.

Mr. Dion asked if service credits can be noted on the New Retiree Report which Director Karpinski said yes and noted that an adjustment has already been referred to the IT vendor. The Director said he hopes to have it available for next month's Board meeting.

Michael DiBiase left the meeting at 11:30

VI. Approval of the July and August Pensions as Presented by ERSRI

On a motion by John P. Maguire and seconded by Roger P. Boudreau, it was unanimously

VOTED: To approve the July and August pensions as presented.

VII. Legal Counsel Report

Attorney Robinson updated the Board on the *Kevin Lang vs. ERSRI* matter, and noted that it could be added to next month's agenda for a more detailed discussion.

Attorney Robinson then suggested that a motion would be in order for the Board to convene in Executive Session pursuant to Rhode Island General Laws section §42-46-5 (a) (2) to discuss the matter identified on the agenda involving a potential pension revocation action against *Scott D. Turner pursuant to R.I.G.L. §36-10.1-1, et seq., the Public Employee Pension Revocation and Reduction Act (PEPRRA)*, which involves potential litigation involving the Retirement Board.

Paul L. Dion, made a motion to enter into executive session pursuant to Rhode Island General Laws section §42-46-5 (a) (2) which was seconded by Roger P. Boudreau. A roll call vote was taken to enter into Executive Session, and the following members were present and voted Yea: Treasurer Seth Magaziner; William B. Finelli; Daniel L. Beardsley; Roger P. Boudreau; Paul L. Dion; Thomas M. Lambert; John P. Maguire; Joanne A. Matisewski; Marianne F. Monte; Thomas A. Mullaney; Claire M. Newell; Jean Rondeau and Dr. Laura Shawhughes. It was unanimously

VOTED: To convene the Board in Executive Session pursuant to Rhode Island General Laws section §42-46-5 (a) (2) to discuss the litigation matter identified on the agenda.

John P. Maguire recused himself from participating in the matter, and exited the Board room.

[Executive Session]

The Board thereafter convened in executive session.

[Return to Open Session]

Upon returning to open session, Board Counsel Michael P. Robinson noted for the record that one unanimous vote had been taken in Executive Session.

Mr. Maguire returned to the Board room.

On a motion made by Roger P. Boudreau and seconded by Paul L. Dion, it was unanimously

VOTED: To exit executive session and return to open session.

VIII. Committee Reports

Disability Subcommittee:







I. MATTERS WITH PROCEDURAL OR SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES

**Kevin Lang v. ERSRI; Workers' Compensation Court; WCC No. 201504163
Retirement Board v. Lang; Providence Superior Court; PC No. 2015-3380**

Change. Kevin Lang, a Cranston firefighter, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension pursuant to R.I.G.L. §45-21.2-9. A pre-trial conference took place on October 28, 2015, at which time the Court denied Mr. Lang's petition for benefits. Mr. Lang thereafter claimed a trial with regard to this decision. **On September 9, 2016, the Court issued a decree and decision overturning the Retirement Board, and awarding accidental disability benefits to Mr. Lang, and a counsel fee to his attorney. The Retirement Board has filed a notice of appeal.**

Simultaneously, the Retirement System filed a declaratory judgment action in the Providence County Superior Court, seeking a declaratory judgment that the Administrative Procedures Act provides the sole avenue for relief for individuals aggrieved by adverse Retirement Board decisions involving claims for accidental disability pensions predicated on an occupational cancer disability. **Mr. Lang has filed a motion to dismiss this action which remains pending.**

Alfred Benjamin v. Seth Magaziner, et al.

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.: PC 2016-4467

New action. Plaintiff is a disability retiree who brought this action against the Retirement Board, the General Treasurer in his capacity as chair of the Board, the Executive Director, and the State of Rhode Island, seeking, *inter alia*, damages, and a determination that the Retirement System cannot make adjustments to his disability allowance based on earned income. The parties have stipulated that no Answer or other response shall be required to be filed until 30 days after Plaintiff's counsel states in writing that an Answer or other response is being requested.

Emile E. Ziadeh v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island Board.

Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC 2016-4629

New action. Plaintiff, a former state employee, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension. The parties are in the process of coordinating service of process.

II. MATTERS WITH NO PROCEDURAL OR SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES

Retirement Board v. Fred Randall

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC15-0203

No Change. This is an action to revoke or reduce Mr. Randall's pension pursuant to the Public Employee Pension Revocation and Reduction Act. Mr. Randall, a former employee of the University of Rhode Island, pled *nolo contendere* to a charge of conversion by a state employee. A hearing wherein Mr. Randall was required to appear and show cause why his pension benefits should not be suspended pending adjudication of the merits of the action took place on March 2, 2014. The Court determined that cause was not shown by Mr. Randall, and ordered that his pension benefits be immediately suspended pending adjudication of the action on the merits. A hearing was conducted on July 7, 2016 at 2:00 PM, at which time Mr. Randall and his wife both testified. The parties are in the process of submitting post-trial memoranda.

Robert L. Lincourt vs. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island

Providence County Superior Court; C.A. No. PC2015-0602

No Change. Plaintiff, a North Providence firefighter, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension. The System's Answer and the Designation of Administrative Record have been filed with the Court. Mr. Lincourt has filed a motion to remand the action to the Retirement Board for the presentation of additional evidence. On July 18, 2016, Judge Taft-Carter issued a decision denying Mr. Lincourt's motion to remand.

Damon Borrelli v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island (ERSRI).

Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC-2016-2817

No Change. Plaintiff, a South Kingstown Police Officer, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension. ERSRI has filed an Answer to Mr. Borelli's First Amended Complaint, and the Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal with the court.

The Retirement Board of the Municipal Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island v. Coventry Fire District, By and Through Frank Palin, John D'Onofrio, Brenda Rapose, and John Cook, in their Capacities as Board Members and Inhabitants of the District, Robert Catalfamo, in his Capacity as Tax Assessor/Collector of the District, and David Krekorian, in his Capacity as Treasurer of the District.

Kent County Superior Court; C.A. No. KC2015-1099

No Change. Plaintiff brings this action seeking to collect unpaid employer and employee contributions to MERS. Defendant has not answered the case, but is seeking verification of the amount of the indebtedness.

Margaret Provoyeur v. Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island.

Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC 2015-2609

No Change. Plaintiff, a Providence school teacher, appeals the denial of her application for an accidental disability pension. On August 24, 2016, Plaintiff filed a motion to remand the matter to the Disability Subcommittee for the consideration of additional evidence. ERSRI has filed an objection, and the matter is scheduled for a conference/hearing on October 28, 2016.

Jeanne Rossi v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island

Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 09-2607

No Change. This action arises out of the denial by the Retirement System of Ms. Rossi's application for attorney's fees pursuant to the Equal Access to Justice Act, related to the earlier denial of her application for an accidental disability pension. The Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal has been filed with the Court. The matter has been fully briefed and assigned to Mr. Justice Rubine for decision.

Jane Robinson v. Frank J. Karpinski in his capacity as Executive Director of the Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island

Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 09-7019

No Change. This action arises out of the denial by the Retirement System of Ms. Robinson's request to purchase service credit for time when she left teaching for maternity reasons. An Answer was filed. The Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal was filed on April 14, 2010. This matter has been fully briefed and assigned to Ms. Justice Hurst for decision.

Sandra Tiernan v. Frank Caprio *et al.*

Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 09-7242

No Change. This declaratory judgment action arises out of the setoff of workers compensation benefits from disability pension benefits. A Stipulation was filed on January 27, 2010 in the administrative appeal prematurely filed with the Superior Court, postponing the filing of an Answer and the Administrative Record pending the conclusion of the administrative proceedings. The Retirement Board has affirmed the administrative actions taken by the Executive Director, and the parties have entered into a briefing schedule with regard to the superior court appeal.

Nancy Langlois v. Frank T. Caprio

Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 10-0909

No Change. This action arises out of the denial by the Retirement Board of Ms. Langlois's application to receive service credit for the time she worked reduced hours after she returned from maternity leave. An Answer and the Designation of the Administrative Record have been filed. On April 26, 2012, Mr. Justice Procaccini remanded the case to the Retirement Board for further proceedings. The matter was referred to the Hearing Officer for further consideration consistent with the April 26, 2012 decision. On October 24, 2012, the Hearing Officer issued a decision again affirming the administrative decision to deny Ms. Langlois's application to receive service credit. On December 12, 2012, the Retirement Board again voted to deny Ms. Langlois's request to obtain service credit. On January 21, 2013, Ms. Langlois filed a First Amended Complaint. The Retirement System's Answer and Amended Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal were filed on January 25, 2013.

Linda Acciardo v. Employee's Retirement System of Rhode Island

Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 10-2822

No Change. This action arises out of the denial by the Retirement Board of Ms. Acciardo's application for accidental disability retirement. Ms. Acciardo was a Chief Inspector for the R.I. Department of Health. An Answer was filed on May 19, 2010. The Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal was filed on June 17, 2010. On August 24, 2012, Mr. Justice Van Couyghen remanded the matter to the Retirement Board for further proceedings. On July 9, 2014, the Retirement Board denied Ms. Acciardo's application. On July 28, 2014, Ms. Acciardo filed a second appeal to the Superior Court. The Retirement System's Answer and Amended Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal have been filed with the Court, and the matter has been fully briefed.

Mary Zayat v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island

Providence County Superior Court CA No. 2012-0716

No Change. This Administrative Appeal arises from Mary Zayat's claims that ERSRI wrongfully denied her application for an accidental disability pension. Ms. Zayat was a Probation and Parole Counselor with the Department of Corrections. The Retirement System's Answer was filed on February 22, 2012. The Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal was filed on February 23, 2012.

Jennifer Leyden v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island

Providence County Superior Court CA No. 2012-1867

No Change. This Administrative Appeal arises from Jennifer Leyden's claims that ERSRI wrongfully denied her application for an accidental disability pension. Ms. Leyden was a teacher for the Providence Public School System. The Retirement System's Answer was filed on June 4, 2012. The Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal was filed on June 5, 2012. The matter was fully briefed and assigned to Mr. Justice Lanphear for decision. On June 5, 2013, Judge Lanphear issued a decision remanding the matter to the Retirement Board for further proceedings. On July 17, 2013, ERSRI filed a petition for issuance of a writ of certiorari with the Rhode Island Supreme Court. On June 11, 2014, the Rhode Island Supreme Court issued an order denying the petition for certiorari as a final judgment has not yet entered. Ms. Leyden filed a motion with the Superior Court attempting to restrict the system's ability to obtain an additional independent medical examination. On October 17, 2014, the Superior Court denied Ms. Leyden's motion.

Peter Ferraro v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island

Washington County Superior Court CA No. 12-0674

No Change. Plaintiff, a Westerly school teacher, appeals the denial of his application for an ordinary disability pension. The Retirement System has filed an Answer and the Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal with the Court. The matter has been fully briefed.

Bouchard v. Central Coventry Fire District

Kent County Superior Court; KB-2012-1150

No Change. On November 25, 2012, Judge Stern issued a decision holding that amendments to the Fiscal Stability Act divested the Court of subject matter jurisdiction over state judicial receiverships for fire districts, but further held that the court's orders issued prior to amendment of the act remained valid. The Court also held that it lacked jurisdiction to enforce the stay order previously entered, which had prevented parties from proceeding directly against CCFD. The Court held that it retained equitable jurisdiction over claims still pending, unrelated to receivership laws. The parties are in discussion regarding payment of the outstanding indebtedness.

John R. Grasso v. Gina M. Raimondo, et al.

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.: PC 2013-3121

No Change. Plaintiff is a disability retiree who brought this action against the Retirement System, the General Treasurer in her individual and official capacities, and the Executive Director in his individual and official capacities, seeking damages, and a determination that the Retirement System cannot require him to undergo an annual medical examination, or make adjustments to his disability allowance based on earned income. In a simultaneous administrative proceeding, on September 10, 2014 the Retirement Board affirmed the Hearing Officer's decision upholding the administrative actions of the Executive Director. On October 8, 2014, Mr. Grasso appealed the Board's decision to the Superior Court, and by agreement of the parties the City of Cranston intervened in the action. On November 5, 2015, the Superior Court issued a declaratory judgment that the System cannot require Mr. Grasso to undergo annual medical examinations, or adjust his pension based on outside earnings. The System has filed a Notice of Appeal, and a Petition for Issuance of a Writ of Certiorari with the Rhode Island Supreme Court. The parties have each filed pre-briefing statements.

Michael T. Brady v. Gina M. Raimondo, et al.

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.: PC 2013-5592

No Change. Plaintiff is a disability retiree who brought this action against the Retirement System, the General Treasurer in her individual and official capacities, and the Executive Director in his individual and official capacities, seeking, *inter alia*, damages, and a determination that the Retirement System cannot make adjustments to his disability allowance based on earned income. The parties have stipulated that the Superior Court action will be held in abeyance while Plaintiff pursues administrative remedies.

Albert DelMastro, Jr. v. Employee's Retirement System of Rhode Island

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC14-1850

No Change. Plaintiff, an electrician with the Community College of Rhode Island, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension. The Retirement System has filed an Answer and the Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal with the Court.

Retirement Board v. Rachel Arruda

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC14-6174

No Change. This is an action to revoke or reduce Ms. Arruda's pension pursuant to the Public Employee Pension Revocation and Reduction Act. Ms. Arruda, a former employee of the City of Woonsocket, pled *nolo contendere* to a felony charge related to conversion of funds in connection with her municipal employment. At a hearing on January 29, 2015, Arruda stipulated to the suspension of her pension pending adjudication of the action.

The Retirement Board of the Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island v. Gerard M. Martineau

Providence County Superior Court; C.A. No. PC 15-1268

No Change. This is an action to revoke or reduce Mr. Martineau's pension pursuant to the Public Employee Pension Revocation and Reduction Act. Mr. Martineau, a former elected official of the State of Rhode Island, pled *nolo contendere* to charges of Honest Services Mail Fraud in connection with his public employment. Mr. Martineau was served with the Complaint on April 2, 2015. Mr. Martineau has agreed to voluntarily relinquish any entitlement to a pension or other benefit he might otherwise have been entitled to, and documents necessary to obtain court approval of revocation of his pension have been sent to him for review.

Benjamin Zanni v. Town of Johnston and ERSRI

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC-2015-4245

No Change. Plaintiff brought suit against the Town of Johnston and ERSRI (as an “interested party”), challenging the City’s decision to deny him medical benefits pursuant to ordinance, based on his prior criminal conviction for conduct in connection with his public employment. The matter was initially removed by the City to federal court, and was then remanded to the superior court. ERSRI has filed an Answer to the Complaint.

Robert E. Falvey v. Seth Magaziner, et al.

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.: PC 2016-0232

No Change. Plaintiff is a disability retiree who brought this action against the Retirement Board, the General Treasurer in his capacity as chair of the Board, the Executive Director, and the State of Rhode Island, seeking, *inter alia*, damages, and a determination that the Retirement System cannot make adjustments to his disability allowance based on earned income. The parties have stipulated that no Answer or other response shall be required to be filed until 30 days after Plaintiff’s counsel states in writing that an Answer or other response is being requested.

Benita Fernandez v. Employee’s Retirement System of Rhode Island

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC2015-5489

No Change. Plaintiff, a Social Caseworker II with DCYF, appeals the denial of her application for an accidental disability pension. The Retirement System has filed an Answer and the Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal with the Court.

Anne Marcaccio v. Central Falls Board of Trustees, and its Members, Anna Cano Morales, Sonia Grace, Hugo Figueroa, Stephanie Gonzalez, Diosa Martinez, Ana Cecilia Rosado, and Ronald Pitt, the North Smithfield School Committee, and its Members, Merredythe Nadeau, Arthur Bassett, Michael Clifford, William J. O’Connell, Liane M. Jalette, James J. Lombardi, III, and John E. Raymond and the Employees’ Retirement System of Rhode Island, by and through the General Treasurer, Seth Magaziner.

Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC 16-1210

No Change. Plaintiff has brought this declaratory judgment action, with the stated intention of obtaining records from her former employers for use in connection with administrative proceedings at ERSRI related to the calculation of service credit, and her corresponding eligibility for a service pension. ERSRI has filed an answer to the complaint.

Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island v. Thomas McSoley, Marlene A. Palumbo, and Michael E. McSoley.

Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC2016-1144

No Change. ERSRI brought suit to recover monies overpaid to a direct deposit account of Thomas McSoley, following his death in 2011. The defendants are believed to be joint account holders with the decedent. ERSRI effectuated service of process, and sought an injunction preventing the defendants from accessing or withdrawing the funds. On March 18, 2006, the parties entered into a Consent Order that restrains the defendants from accessing, withdrawing, encumbering, or otherwise spending or disposing of the funds on account until further order of the Court.



Monthly Meeting Minutes

August 1, 2016

The Monthly Meeting of the State Investment Commission (SIC) was called to order at 9:05 a.m., Monday, August 1, 2016 at Brown University's School of Professional Studies located at 200 Dyer St. in Providence.

I. Roll Call of Members

The following members were present: Mr. Robert Benson, Mr. Michael Costello, Mr. Thomas Fay, Mr. Karpinski, Ms. Marie Langlois, Ms. Sylvia Maxfield, Ms. Paula McNamara, Mr. Thomas Mullaney, Ms. Marcia Reback, and Treasurer Seth Magaziner.

Also in attendance: Mr. John Burns and Mr. Allen Emkin of Pension Consulting Alliance (PCA), general consultants; Ms. Sally Dowling of Adler Pollock & Sheehan P.C., legal counsel; Mr. Tim Nguyen, Chief Investment Officer (interim); Mr. Patrick Marr, Chief of Staff; Ms. Kerri Baker, Cash Manager, and members of the Treasurer's staff.

Treasurer Magaziner called the meeting to order at 9:05 a.m.

II. Asset Liability Study Discussion

Treasurer Magaziner framed the discussion noting the purpose of the day's meeting was to talk about risk tolerance and set parameters around those targeted areas of risk, as well as make assumptions for asset classes. The goal was to establish criteria to create a portfolio with the best expected return within an acceptable level of risk.

Mr. Emkin and Mr. Burns then began to discuss risk preferences. Mr. Emkin explained what is currently in place and has been done to date in order to provide context within the risk framework. Additionally, using historical returns can help in determining helpful correlations for future risk. Mr. Emkin noted that contribution and liquidity are the most important considerations.

The board asked questions.

The model would take into the following constraints: a low probability of having the funding ratio drop below 50%, a low probability of the employer contribution rate rising above 30% of payroll, and maintaining sufficient liquidity to meet obligations in a stressed environment.

Mr. Emkin transitioned to speaking about how to categorize asset classes and what role the different strategies are supposed to play. He explained it will be important to define and categorize these classes in order to make clear which role each will play, which will increase transparency and aid the public in understanding the purpose each strategy is intended to play within the larger portfolio.

Mr. Emkin outlined the current portfolio structure, including its current target allocation, outlining the role each asset plays. He then delved into the possible portfolio structure and framework models that could be used going forward, detailing the strengths and weaknesses of each and spending a considerable amount of

time going over a new type of asset category, the 'Risk MitigationPortfolio'. Regardless of the structure selected, Mr. Emkin cautioned that its development should be a phased process to account for the implementation risk of such change.

The board asked questions.

Mr. Emkin said it is worth considering a functional class for crisis protection because ERSRI has a large negative cash flow and the new class would offset economic growth risk and provide significant positive returns and liquidity during a significant market downturn. PCA advised it might be prudent to explore an allocation to alternative premia (also known as alternative beta), long-term treasuries, and systematic trend strategies in the model as they would provide diversification benefits.

These strategies could be obtained in a cost effective manner and have monthly liquidity.

The board asked questions.

The board settled on testing models with and without the new functional class, and staff will examine further pros and cons of its implementation based on model results.

Mr. Emkin presented capital market assumptions and asset class constraints to the board. He explained that inflation and real return assets will be what gives expected return going forward. He then went into great detail regarding the preliminary capital market assumptions and constraints as outlined by PCA.

The board asked questions.

The board directed PCA to alter several areas of the modeling constraints in order to coincide with its goals. The selected constraints will be used to run the initial model and results will be presented at the September 8th meeting.

III. Community Deposit Program Update

Ms. Baker presented information on People's Credit Union, an institution that would like to participate in the Community Deposit Program. The office has done its due diligence on People's Credit Union and has found that it meets the criteria set forth in the SIC investment policy, making it eligible for participation.

On a motion by Ms. Reback and seconded by Mr. Benson, it was unanimously
VOTED: to approve People's Credit Union as an investment bank

IV. 529 Plan Audit Update: Agreed Upon Procedures

Mr. Marr spoke to the SIC in May 2016 regarding the retention of Marcum LLP for the FY 2016 financial statement audit due to the transitions taking place between both RIHEAA to Treasury and Alliance Bernstein to Ascensus. At the time, Mr. Marr asked the board to approve entering a contract with Marcum for an amount not to exceed \$30,000. The SIC voted unanimously to do so at that time. Furthermore, Mr. Marr explained that the Auditor General and the Treasury also find it prudent to perform an Agreed Upon Procedures engagement with respect to the asset transition in addition to the financial audit statement because all of the assets did not transfer in the same fiscal year. The Agreed Upon Procedures engagement would evaluate specific items related to the cross-receipts of assets through July 8th, when the transition was completed. It is best to do so at this time as it forms a stronger basis for next year's financial

statement audit since the termination of the contract with Alliance Bernstein would make it more difficult to gather contacts and good information to properly execute certain audit activities in 2017.

On a motion by Mr. Mullaney and seconded by Ms. Reback, it was unanimously **VOTED: to approve contracting Marcum LLP for an Agreed Upon Procedures engagement not to exceed \$20,000.**

V. Legal Counsel Report

Ms. Dowling informed the Board that a vote to approve the minutes had been inadvertently left out of the agenda and asked that a motion to approve the minutes be taken.

On a motion by Mr. Costello and seconded by Ms. Reback, it was unanimously **VOTED: to approve the minutes of the June SIC meeting.**

VI. Chief Investment Officer Report

Mr. Nguyen gave the performance report for June, noting BREXIT as the key influential factor on the markets for the month. The overall portfolio saw a 0.17% increase for the month, just missing the benchmark of 0.18% and beating the 60/40 benchmark, which decreased by 0.36%. Some notable performers on the month include North American Equities and Emerging Market Equities while International Equities and Equity Hedge Fund program (not to be confused with the Real Return Hedge Fund program, which posted a positive return on the month) underperformed.

Mr. Nguyen then explored the fiscal year numbers, saying it was a mixed year for plan performance as it outperformed the policy benchmark while protecting against steep investment losses in a very challenging year. Using the Sortino Ratio, which is a measure used to understand the downside protection of a portfolio, the plan's 5 and 10 year returns demonstrated great downside protection against the benchmark and the 60/40. For example, the plan declined 0.27% down on the year while equity lost significantly more for the year.

Illiquid strategies such as real estate and infrastructure, performed well, both having had strong returns. Private equity also did well on the year.

Low oil prices affected energy MLPs, which has declined on the year. Emerging markets index funds were also lackluster as they dropped more than 20% in the first two quarters of the year alone due to falling commodity prices and social and political unrest.

Mr. Nguyen also issued an investment administration update: PIMCO experienced an executive change. Although it is not likely to affect the portfolio, it is something to note.

VII. Treasurer's General Comments

Treasurer Magaziner observed the plan beat out the benchmark for the year by about 10 basis points. He credited this to the staff's manager selection in private equity and real estate.

He stated he looks forward to seeing the model outputs in September and went on to thank the staff and board for navigating a difficult environment over the past year.

Raised by Ms. McNamara, Treasurer Magaziner also addressed the fact that Mr. Nguyen is an interim Chief Investment Officer and that there will be a search for a permanent CIO come September. He stated there would be further discussion on that topic when the search begins.

There being no other business to come before the Board, on a motion by Ms. Reback and seconded by Mr. Fay the meeting adjourned at 3:38 p.m.

The Monthly Meeting of the State Investment Commission (SIC) was called to order at 9:04 a.m., Thursday September 8, 2016 in Room 205 of the State House.

I. Roll Call of Members

The following members were present: Mr. Michael Costello, Mr. Thomas Fay, Ms. Marie Langlois, Ms. Sylvia Maxfield, Ms. Paula McNamara, Mr. Thomas Mullaney, Ms. Marcia Reback, and Treasurer Seth Magaziner.

Mr. Frank Karpinski arrived at 9:06

Also in attendance: Mr. John Burns and Mr. Allen Emkin of Pension Consulting Alliance (PCA), general consultants; Ms. Sally Dowling of Adler Pollock & Sheehan P.C., legal counsel; Mr. Tim Nguyen, Chief Investment Officer (interim); and members of the Treasurer's staff.

Treasurer Magaziner called the meeting to order at 9:04 a.m.

II. Approval of Minutes

On a motion by Mr. Fay and seconded by Ms. Maxfield it was unanimously

VOTED: to approve the draft of the minutes of the June 22nd, 2016 meeting of the State Investment Commission.

III. Approval of Minutes

On a motion by Mr. Costello and seconded by Ms. Langlois, it was unanimously

VOTED: to approve the draft of the minutes of the July 13th, 2016 meeting of the State Investment Commission.

IV. Asset Liability Initial Model Review

Mr. Emkin began by stating the goal of today's meeting was to get direction from the Board in order to refine outputs from the portfolio optimization exercise, which would allow for a recommendation at the September 28th meeting. He explained that a lot of work has already been conducted with PCA and Treasury staff, developing numerous iterations to produce the initial models.

Mr. Emkin explained that the models took into consideration the various constraints which were set forth by the Board at the August meeting. This includes optimizing the long-term funding ratio and minimizing the risk of the portfolio falling beneath the 50% funding ratio in the next 5 years. Additionally, the model was carried out with the hopes of minimizing the potential costs relating to payroll. Simultaneously, the model took into consideration the Crisis Risk Offset (CRO), whose purpose is to offset economic growth risk, to minimize performance drawdown, and to provide liquidity during a crisis.

Mr. Emkin highlighted that all versions of the model simulation produced improved results relative to the current portfolio and 60/40.

Mr. Emkin stated that the Board is primarily tasked at this meeting to determine the possible inclusion of the new CRO class, as well as rebalancing the weight assigned to each asset class.

Mr. Emkin pointed out that the model supports a larger allocation to private equity and income class. Conversely, the model supports a lower allocation to inflation protection class and fixed income. He went on to outline how these areas, as well as the other strategic classes, performed under the constraints in the various models.

The Board asked questions.

Mr. Burns then explained the components of CRO. The Board was presented with results from models including and excluding the CRO. The CRO was found to have a positive role in the model portfolio. The Board made adjustments to various asset class weights based on the models which included CROs. It was determined that Treasury staff should aim to balance the US Equity and Non-US Equity asset classes and to slightly increase the Inflation protection bucket. The Board also asked PCA to run the various scenarios again with CRO, assuming an allocation between 8-12%.

As part of the CRO discussion, Mr. Burns presented on Alternative Risk Capture, a sub-component of CRO. The Alternative Risk Capture attempts to capture alternative sources of returns and to enhance portfolio performance. By design, it is market neutral. The Board requested to explore models with and without this component when developing models with the CRO.

V. Legal Counsel Report

There was no legal counsel to report.

VI. Chief Investment Officer Report

Mr. Nguyen gave the performance report for July. This is the first month in Treasurer Magaziner's term that the portfolio posted positive returns across all disciplines. The portfolio saw an increase of 2.37% for the month, marginally failing to meet its benchmark of 2.48% and the 60/40 benchmark of 2.84%. On the calendar year, the portfolio increased 5.10%, exceeding the plan benchmark of 4.78% but underperforming the 5.90% on the 60/40. He explained that riskier asset classes such as emerging markets and global equities saw a rally, and MLPs and traditional fixed income also saw notable increases. These relative returns were driven by favorable security selection.

Mr. Nguyen cited the bubble chart in the SIC materials, showing that for the last 5 years, the total plan has lower portfolio volatility than the plan benchmark as well as the 60/40. During that same time frame, the portfolio's 6.34% return significantly outperformed the 60/40 benchmark of 5.64%: more return, less risk.

VII. Treasurer's General Comments

Treasurer Magaziner noted the Asset/Liability Study is reaching its conclusion and recognized the hard work of all parties involved in the process. When asked what the course of action would be if the models returned on September 28th were not satisfactory to the Board, Treasurer Magaziner assured the group that the Board would take as much time as necessary to develop a portfolio where all would be comfortable. He also explained that any changes made to portfolio would be an incremental process to ensure a smooth transition.

There being no other business to come before the Board, on a motion by Ms. Maxfield and seconded by Ms. Reback the meeting adjourned at 11:59 a.m.

Portfolio Highlights

PORTFOLIO PERFORMANCE

August 2016

For the month, the total portfolio value increased by approximately \$20.4 million to rest at \$7.67 billion. The month's increase comes from \$34.2 million of positive investment performance reduced by \$13.8 million of transfers to meet pension payroll in excess of pension contributions. On a percentage basis, the portfolio rose by 0.44% exceeding the plan benchmark of 0.34% and the 0.16% return from the basic 60% global equity/40% fixed income allocation.



Calendar year-to-date, the total portfolio value has increased by \$77.0 million, with portfolio gains of \$333.5 million offset by \$256.5 million in pension payments. The portfolio's 5.42% investment gain fell short of the benchmark's 5.93%, as well as the 60/40 allocation's 6.98% return.

Fiscal year-to-date, the total portfolio has increased by \$149.1 million, with portfolio gains of \$187.5 million offset by \$38.4 million in pension payments. The portfolio's 2.83% return lagged the 2.85% benchmark and the 60/40 portfolio of 3.00%.

Over a 3 year time frame and when comparing against a 60/40 portfolio, we slightly underperformed at 5.89% when the 60/40 portfolio earned 5.96%. Over a 5 year time frame and when comparing against a 60/40 portfolio, we significantly outperformed at 7.17% when the 60/40 portfolio posted 6.49%.


For the month of August, Equities edged higher with some indices reaching all-time highs. Government bonds lost ground, except in the UK and Australia where central banks cut rates to pre-empt economic slowdowns. The US dollar appreciated versus other major currencies. Commodity markets provided more substantial price action as speculation around supply-demand imbalances led to rallies within the energy sector and sharp sell-off in a number of soft commodities. Overall, moves in global financial markets were modest in the month of August in terms of market volatility.






Global Public Equity - by Industry Sector




Global Public Equity - by Geography






Bubble-Size Scaled based on Current Allocations






Commitment by Vintage Year




Historical Cash Flows and Valuation




Historical Performance


Commitment by Vintage Year






Commitment by Vintage Year






A risk-adjusted measure developed by Nobel Laureate William Sharpe. It is calculated by using standard deviation and excess return to determine reward per unit of risk. The higher the Sharpe Ratio, the better the portfolio's historical risk-adjusted performance. The Sharpe Ratio can be used to compare two portfolios directly with regard to how much excess return each portfolio achieved for a certain level of risk. Morningstar first calculates a monthly Sharpe Ratio and then annualizes it to put the number in a more useful one-year context.

Standard Deviation (Source: Morningstar Direct) The statistical measurement of dispersion about an average, which depicts how widely a stock or portfolio's returns varied over a certain period of time.
