SUBJECT: State and Local Coverage - Rhode Island Modification No. 31

COMMENTS: Cleared for approval.

The 1930 Act "To Incorporate the Saylesville Fire District in the Town of Lincoln," which was submitted by the State, indicates that the district has territorial identity, the power to sue and be sued and other powers generally incident to corporations, and its "taxable inhabitants" have power to order taxes and provide for the assessing and collecting of the same. Accordingly, we believe this district to be a "political subdivision" eligible for separate coverage under the agreement.
