This is the first instance of coverage of a regional school district under the Rhode Island agreement.

The Foster - Gloucester Regional School District was established by Chapter 109 of the 1958 Rhode Island Acts as "a body politic and corporate with all the powers and duties pertaining to education conferred by law upon cities and towns generally," including the power to sue and be sued similarly to a town and to acquire property by purchase, gift, other means of transfer or condemnation (Sec. 2). We note, moreover, that, pursuant to Chapter 197 of the 1958 Rhode Island Acts, regional school districts are now constituted as bodies politic and corporate under general provisions of law (G.L. R.I. secs. 16-3-11 and 16-3-25).

Accordingly, it appears that the Foster - Gloucester Regional School District qualifies for separate social security coverage under the Rhode Island enabling law (G.L. R.I. sec. 36-7-2 (3)(c) and (4)(c)) and as a "political subdivision" within the meaning of section 218 and the Rhode Island agreement.


