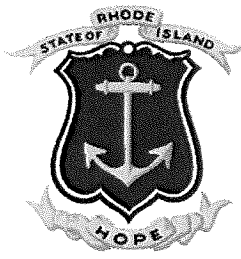

The Monthly Meeting of the Retirement Board was called to order at 9:08 a.m. Monday, May 15, 2017, in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor Conference Room, 50 Service Avenue, Warwick, RI.

**I. Roll Call of Members**

The following members were present at roll call: General Treasurer Seth Magaziner; Vice Chair William B. Finelli; Roger P. Boudreau; Mark A. Carruolo; Brian M. Daniels; Michael DiBiase; Paul L. Dion, Ph.D.; Thomas M. Lambert; John P. Maguire; Thomas A. Mullaney; Claire M. Newell; Marcia B. Reback; Jean Rondeau and Dr. Laura Shawhughes.

Also in attendance: Frank J. Karpinski, ERSRI Executive Director and Attorney Michael P. Robinson, Board Counsel.

Recognizing a quorum, Treasurer Magaziner called the meeting to order.

**II. Approval of Minutes**

On a motion by Claire Newell and seconded by Thomas A. Mullaney, it was unanimously **VOTED: To approve the draft regular minutes and the draft executive session minutes of the April 12, 2017 meeting of the Retirement Board of the Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island.**

**III. Chairperson's Report**

Treasurer Magaziner introduced the new Chief Investment Officer (CIO) Mr. Alec Stais and said he will be working with the interim CIO Tim Nguyen.

**IV. Executive Director's Report**

Director Karpinski apprised the Board they were in possession of the Disability Subcommittee Report dated May 8, 2017, the Pension Application Report, two memorandums from Gabriel, Roeder, Smith and Company (GRS) and a revised presentation of the 2017 Actuarial Experience Study by GRS.

Director Karpinski apprised the Board that the Member Services Subcommittee charter was approved at their April 12, 2017 meeting. The Director apprised the Board that included in their book, they have been provided the final version of the approved charter for their consideration.

On a motion by Marcia B. Reback and seconded by John P. Maguire, it was unanimously **VOTED: To approve the Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island Charter for the Member Services Subcommittee.**

Director Karpinski reminded the Board that the Governance Subcommittee also met on April 12, 2017 and noted that both Chairman Maguire and Chairperson Reback will provide their updates during the Committee Reports.

Director Karpinski apprised the Board that both the Administration, Audit, Risk and Compliance and Member Services Subcommittees will meet on June 14, 2017.

Regarding the MERS delinquency report, Director Karpinski updated the Board that the Town of North Providence is now current.

**Presentation and Potential Approval of the Actuarial Experience Study by Gabriel, Roeder, Smith and Company for the Six-Year Period Ending June 30, 2016**

Treasurer Magaziner reminded the Board that the approval of the experience study is one of the Board's most important tasks, and that the adoption of reasonable assumptions is critical to insuring the long-term health of the fund. He said as fiduciaries of the Trust, the Board's duty is to the members of the plan, and trustees must act in the best interest of the health of the Retirement System.

Treasurer Magaziner then introduced Mr. Joseph P. Newton, FSA, of Gabriel, Roeder, Smith and Company (GRS) to present the Actuarial Experience Study for the Six-Year Period Ending June 30, 2016 to the Board.

Mr. Newton apprised the Board that the primary purpose of the annual actuarial valuation is to either set or assess the adequacy of the contribution (funding) policy. He said the purpose of the experience study is to review the actuarial assumptions and methods that are utilized to develop each of the outputs of an actuarial valuation process. Mr. Newton noted that ERSRI's practice is to perform the analysis every three years.

Mr. Newton discussed the assumption set and standards of practice. He added that if the Board chooses an assumption that was not appropriate or was not reasonable with these standards of practice, GRS would have to qualify its report. Mr. Dion asked if a more conservative assumption is selected would it need to be qualified. Mr. Newton said no in that the Board can be more conservative within reason.

Mr. Newton highlighted his general findings noting that future economic growth is likely to continue to be suppressed compared to historical levels and current wage inflation and projected payroll growth needs to be lowered. He said retirees continue to live longer, and the expectations for the rates of future improvement in life expectancies should be expected. He also said members are pushing off retirement, and retiring later than previously projected. He states that most of the other existing assumptions continue to be appropriate.

Mr. Newton provided the Board with a summary of recommendations. Specifically, major recommendations included lowering the inflation assumption from 2.75% to 2.50%, which lowers the nominal investment return assumption from 7.50% to 7.25%, the nominal wage inflation assumption from 3.25% to 3.00% and the expected CPI Cola formula from 2.40% to 2.30% (Net Contingent 2.15%)

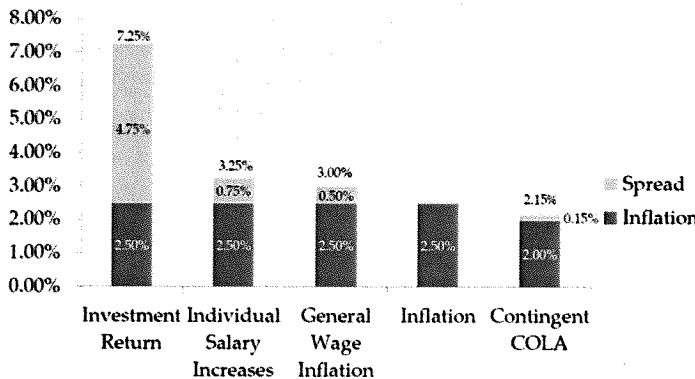
For moderate recommendations Mr. Newton recommended small changes to individual merit and promotion portion of salary scales, lower nominal payroll growth rate to 3.00% for all groups except Teachers and decreasing probability of retirement (extend working career) for most groups. For a minor recommendation, he said there is a small adjustment to disability patterns (i.e. fewer disabilities).

Mr. Dion asked about the turnover assumption relative to those employees in the system not eligible for retirement and questioned once those employees stay beyond the threshold, is the probability of leaving low. Mr. Newton said there were no changes to the turnover assumptions for State Employees but small changes to teachers. Mr. Dion noted turnover in his department but Mr. Newton said the data did not suggest that with the exception of Teachers. Mr. Dion asked if turnover is controlled by age which Mr. Newton said yes and that it is service related so the distribution is going to be weighted more and that an older retiree would count more.

Mr. Newton said the assumed inflation rate (currently 2.75% per year) is not used directly in the actuarial valuation, but it impacts the development of investment return assumption; cost of living adjustments; salary increase assumptions and payroll growth rate (budget growth rate).

Mr. Newton recommended lowering the inflation assumption to 2.50% since it is closer to recent levels; closer to levels expected in the bond market; closer to investment consultants and professional forecaster estimates. He provided to the Board the following graph noting inflation is the first building block for other economic assumptions.

Decreasing the inflation assumption, by default, lowers the nominal values for the other economic assumptions

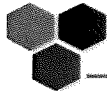
Mr. Dion asked Mr. Newton if for the time period of 2012-2016, is 2.75% a fair rate, Mr. Newton said yes. Mr. Dion raised concerns that the System missed the assumption by a half and when the assumption was 3% for the 2007-2011 time period it was missed by roughly 74 basis points. Mr. Newton said these are long-term assumptions and the recommendation is to reduce the assumption. Mr. Newton noted that experience studies are done every three years and using the recommended 2.5% was more appropriate where if it was 2.25% and that was too low he would have to recommend raising it again.

Mr. Newton provided a review process on the investment return assumption, noting that there may be no single "correct" answer. He noted the current assumption is 7.50% based on a 2.75% inflation assumption (real return of 4.75%). He noted the assumption is selected using a process that considers historical investment performance, comparison with peers, ERSRI target asset allocation and most importantly, economic capital market expectations.

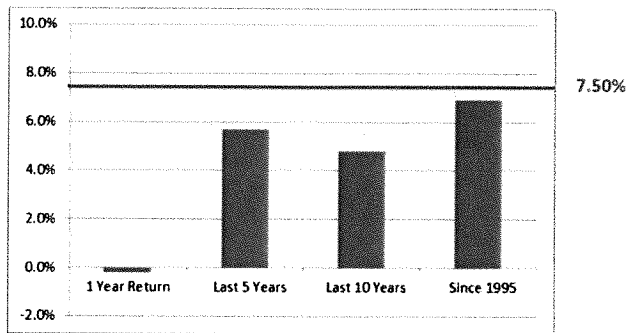
Mr. Dion wanted to clarify the inflation assumption used by PCA for the State Investment Commission of 2.25% and the return from the portfolio which were 6.8% as confirmed by Mr. John Burns of PCA and Mr. Newton. Mr. Dion questioned the real return of 4.5%

and asked why would there be a projected decline in real returns with PCA. Mr. Burns said that the analysis was from 2016-2017 capital market returns where expected returns for equity were down marginally and an assumption of additional volatility over the next 10 years.

Mr. Newton then provided to the Board a graph of the history of net market returns:

Mr. Newton recommended decreasing the investment return assumption to at least 7.25% which would leave the expected real return assumption at 4.75%. He said the 7.25% assumption over the next 10 years has a 46.5% probability of meeting or exceeding 7.25%. However, Mr. Newton said if the Board is uncomfortable with the low probability of achieving the 7.25% return, they should consider a move to 7.00%.

Mr. Newton then discussed the wage assumptions. He said they should be consistent and tied to inflation. He said general wage inflation (GWI) (inflation plus real wage growth in the general economy), also represents the overall budget growth of the Plan Sponsor. He said it is used to project revenue growth and determine the funding period. It is currently 3.25% (2.75% + 0.50%) and said it would be 3.00% after the change to inflation (2.50% + 0.50%).

Mr. Newton then discussed and recommended the following changes to salary increase assumptions:

- a. For State Employees, lower the ultimate component of the salary schedules from 3.50% to 3.25%. Slight change in step rates.
- b. For Teachers, lower the ultimate component of the salary schedules from 3.50% to 3.00%.
- c. For General MERS Employees, lower the ultimate component of the salary schedules from 3.50% to 3.25%. Slight change in step rates.
- d. For MERS Public Safety Employees, no change to the current 4.00% ultimate component.

Mr. Daniels and Mr. Dion asked Mr. Newton about the last 10 years' average of salary increases. Mr. Dion said that 1.5% in COLA resulting in 6% over 4 years has been paid and queried how that breaks down given larger numbers. Mr. Newton said the difference is promotions and merit increases.

Mr. Dion wanted to clarify that the individual salary scale assumed general productivity/merit/promotion above inflation of 75 basis points are totally separate from the 50 basis points of the general wage inflation that already accounts for some sort of level productivity. Mr. Newton said it does not, it overlaps. He explained that the 75% is 50% from the general and the 25% from individual merit. Mr. Newton said the old assumption set would have been 2.75% for inflation plus 50% for general and 25% for individual merit promotion and steps on top of that.

Mr. DiBiase asked Mr. Newton how were the increases previously as the data was closer to 1.50%. Mr. Newton said for the 2001-2011 time frame, there were high pay increases in the public sector across the country. He said GRS was careful during that time frame to not overreact as well.

Mr. Newton then discussed and recommended a reduction in the payroll growth rate assumption from 3.25% to 3.00% for groups except for Teachers where the reduction would go from 3.00% to 2.50%.

Mr. Daniels asked if the MERS Public Safety was just MERS or also State Police and Correctional Officers. Mr. Newton said it is just MERS Public Safety.

Mr. Newton next discussed post-retirement mortality and said in setting the longevity assumption, the actuary must make two decisions, namely, how long are annuitants currently living and what improvement in longevity is expected in the future? After discussion, he recommended updating the base mortality table to variants of the most recently published RP-2014 tables. For the projected improvement assumption, he recommended U-MP (medium) tables and he was recommending ERSRI continue to use a fully generational approach to project future mortality improvement.

Mr. Maguire asked Mr. Newton about the 2010-2011 assumptions when the Board adopted a mortality table (AA) which had a component that was self-correcting and able to internalize increases in longevity which was aggressive at the time. Mr. Newton agreed that was the most conservative table that existed. He said if the Board had not adopted that assumption then the current change would be very significant. Mr. Maguire said the adoption of the AA scale proves that projections were accurate.

Mr. Daniels noted no separate category for Public Safety for life expectancy and noted other studies suggested that life expectancy for Public Safety is getting closer or higher than general employees. Mr. Newton said some plans have their own but given the MERS plan size the national tables are almost the same so it would be prudent to use the national tables.

Mr. Newton then discussed an alternative funding strategy that considered the 50%, or lower, probability of achieving a 7.25% return assumption.

Mr. Newton told the Board that lowering the investment return assumption to 7.0% is the best way to increase the probability of achieving the assumption. However, by default, this would increase contribution requirements over the short term. He said the current funding policy would fully recognize the increase in normal cost in FY2020 and then amortize the increase in UAAL from the new assumptions over the 20-year period from FY2020 to FY2039. Mr. Newton provided the Board the optional strategy of staggering the recognition of the increased UAAL, that start the amortization of each individual part at different points in the future. More specifically, this plan would lower the assumed rate of return to 7.0%, fully recognizing the increase in normal cost in FY2020 and then split the UAAL into 4 parts and setup 4 individual amortization schedules over FY2021-FY2040, FY2022-FY2041, FY2023-FY2042, FY2024-2043. This plan would reduce the

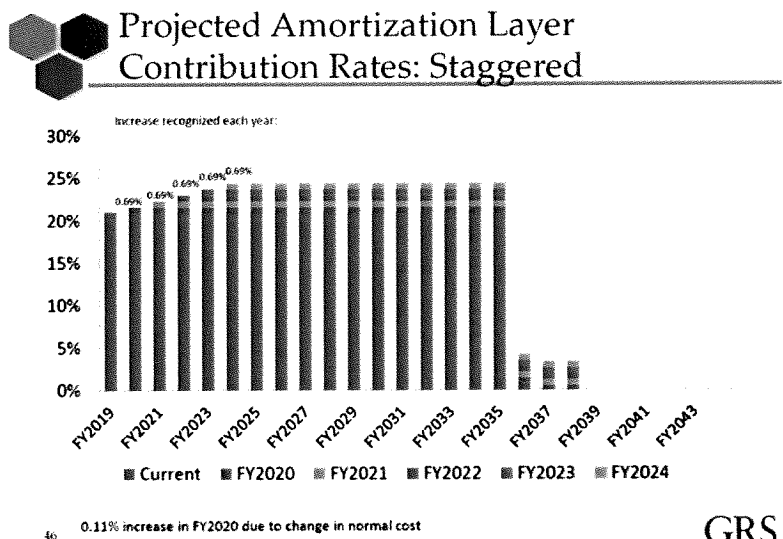


near-term budget impact of the assumption change, and increase costs over the full term of each new amortization period.

Mr. Daniels queried to Mr. Newton, who confirmed, relative to the MERS Public Safety the substantial increase on contribution rates is largely due to wages not being reduced. Mr. Newton said the age 50 with 25 years of service retirement creates a lot of leverage in that there is not enough time to fund if the assumption if it is overestimated.

Mr. Newton said the staggering method would have very low impact in 2020, followed by an increasing pattern in FY2021 to 2024. His strategy would formulate an approach where the amount of each year's layer is varied to create a level contribution rate increase over each of the five years and he also decreased the amortization period for the staggered layers to maintain the projected date at which the system will reach 80% funded.

Mr. Newton used the following graph to demonstrate the methodology:

Mr. Newton said the timing of the impact are for use in the upcoming June 30, 2017 actuarial valuations and he is not recommending nor anticipating a change to the FY2019 contributions that have already been approved by the Board. The first impact will be in the FY2020 contribution rates.

Mr. DiBiase asked Mr. Newton why GRS is not recommending staggering 7.25%. Mr. Newton said it is a give-and-take. He said if relief is being considered for FY2020, offsetting those costs with at lower assumed rate of return is a good choice.

Treasurer Magaziner asked Mr. Newton to clarify the System's two-year delay before any fiscal impact is longer and what is generally seen is one year thus the effect is more gradual.

Mr. Newton then provided the Board with the following actuarial impacts using the FY2016 valuation data for illustrative purposes only:

In summary, Mr. Newton informed the Board that combined with the other recommendations, either assumption of 7.25% or 7.00% is an appropriate rate. He said he is also comfortable with a reasonable phase-in to the higher contribution amounts in conjunction with the 7.00% scenario. Lastly, he believes either of these scenarios provide a better reflection of future experience and will provide more stability when compared to the current assumption set.

Treasurer Magaziner apprised the Board that his first choice is the 7% staggered plan as he feels that 7% is a more realistic assumption, in line with the real return assumptions from PCA and other consultants and due to the volatility penalty, the longer the time horizon the lower the real return projection should be. He said he is also sensitive to the fact that the State, cities, towns and schools need time to plan and budget for a change. The Treasurer summarized his thoughts saying that having a high assumed rate of return will generate long-term costs if the rate is not attained and his goal is having a sustainable System, reliability for employees and affordability for employers.

Mr. Boudreau wanted to confirm the COLA's scheduled in years 2020 and beyond until the fund reaches 80% funding. He said under the current discount rate the investment return portion of the COLA is the fund performance minus 5.5% and if a 7% assumed rate of return is adopted, then then calculation would be 5% minus the fund performance, Mr. Newton agreed. Mr. Boudreau then confirmed that if 7% is adopted rather than 7.25% and the markets fall short on assumed rate of return, the actuarial impact would be smaller for cities and towns, Mr. Newton also agreed.

Treasurer Magaziner introduced Mr. John Burns of Pension Consulting Alliance (PCA) to speak to the Board. Mr. Burns noted, as he did in the February board meeting, to expect interest rates to rise from historically low levels and expected returns will be relatively low compared to long-term data due to the starting point. He said the inflation rate projected by GRS is 2.5% while PCA uses 2.25%. Mr. Burns told the Board that reasonably for 10 years 2.25% is practical but 30 years out as GRS indicates, their assumption of 2.5%

is reasonable. He closed noting that PCA's capital markets assumptions are quite in line with GRS's.

Mr. Daniels asked Mr. Burns his opinion on if an inflation rate of 2.25% and a rate of return of 4.75% totaling 7% was used. Mr. Burns said the current environment it is challenging and risky and noted that the marginally higher return received for taking more risk is minimal.

Treasurer Magaziner apprised the Board that the RI Association of Firefighters provided him a memo that he read into the record that they are opposed to changing the assumed rate of return on the basis that they note today most plans still use the rate of return of 7.5% or higher. Their memo also noted that they wanted to see how the System's performance would be after the transition away from hedge funds before making a rate change.

Mr. Dion asked Mr. Burns if the adopted asset allocation by the SIC was the optimal allocation. Mr. Burns said given the capital market assumptions, constraints and trade-off between downside and bad markets, the SIC concluded it was the best allocation given the risk preferences.

Mr. DiBiase told the Board that he would support the recommended assumption using the 7% stagger. He said to increase the contributions to employers which create issues on hiring staff and fairness puts pressure on operations and felt the stagger provides some flexibility.

Mr. Dion noted his concern about the 2.5% inflation assumption being too high and said he had serious questions on the salary increase rates. Mr. Newton discussed the issues of lowering the inflation assumption relative to the other assumptions and felt the current recommendation was reasonable. Mr. Dion also noted he was not completely comfortable with the stagger and suggested perhaps another experience study be done sooner.

Mr. Daniels asked Mr. Newton about the disability assumption rates and if he had any comparisons to other plans and best practices. Mr. Newton said comparing disability practices across other the states is difficult as benefit provisions can vary quite significantly. He also said given the limited data of the MERS and ERS plans also makes comparison difficult. Mr. Newton also said the disability factor is not a big component in the cost structure and the impact is minimal. Mr. Daniels said doing a deeper data drive could possibly be a consideration. Treasurer Magaziner said a benchmarking would be beneficial.

Mr. Maguire asked Mr. Newton if the Board did not accept the recommended assumption changes would GRS issue a qualified opinion to ERSRI. Mr. Newton said quite possibly but he would notify the Board prior to the issuance and certifications of the FY 2017 valuations in December. He said under the actuarial standards he would need to disclose his findings in the valuation. Mr. Maguire then asked Mr. Newton if he was comfortable with the 7% staggered assumed rate of return method. Mr. Newton said that he was, given the move to the lower assumption.

A motion was then made by Marcia B. Reback and seconded by Jean Rondeau to approve the following experience study recommendations made by GRS in the draft experience study report, except for using the 7.00% investment return assumption with the contribution increase stagger rather than the 7.25% noted in the report, for use in the June 30, 2017 actuarial valuations:

1. Decrease the general inflation assumption from 2.75% to 2.50%.
2. Decrease the nominal investment return assumption from 7.50% to 7.00%.

3. Decrease the general wage growth assumption from 3.25% to 3.00%.
4. Changes to salary increase assumptions:
  - a. For State Employees, lower the ultimate component of the salary schedules from 3.50% to 3.25%. Slight change in step rates.
  - b. For Teachers, lower the ultimate component of the salary schedules from 3.50% to 3.00%.
  - c. For General MERS Employees, lower the ultimate component of the salary schedules from 3.50% to 3.25%. Slight change in step rates.
  - d. For MERS Public Safety Employees, no change to the current 4.00% ultimate component.
5. Reduce the payroll growth rate assumption from 3.25% to 3.00% for groups except Teachers. For Teachers, reduce from 3.00% to 2.50% payroll growth rate.
6. Decrease the assumption for the contingent post-retirement benefit adjustments to be 2.15% per year.
7. Update the post-retirement mortality tables to variants of the RP-2014 table. For the improvement scale, update to the ultimate rates of the MP-2016 projection scale.
8. For State Employees, Teachers, and General MERS retirement rates, decrease the probability of retirement during the first year of eligibility. Remove load at first eligibility for MERS PF.
9. Slightly modify the rates of disability for most groups based on the experience of the individual group.

The Monthly Meeting of the Retirement Board was called to order at 10:09 a.m. Wednesday, June 14, 2017, in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor Conference Room, 50 Service Avenue, Warwick, RI.

**I. Roll Call of Members**

The following members were present at roll call: General Treasurer Seth Magaziner; Vice Chair William B. Finelli; Roger P. Boudreau; Brian M. Daniels; Michael DiBiase; Paul L. Dion, Ph.D.; Thomas M. Lambert; John P. Maguire; Marianne F. Monte; Thomas A. Mullaney; Claire M. Newell; Marcia B. Reback; Jean Rondeau and Dr. Laura Shawhughes.

Also in attendance: Frank J. Karpinski, ERSRI Executive Director and Attorney Michael P. Robinson, Board Counsel.

Recognizing a quorum, Treasurer Magaziner called the meeting to order.

**II. Approval of Minutes**

On a motion by John P. Maguire and seconded by Roger P. Boudreau, it was unanimously **VOTED: To approve the draft regular minutes and the draft executive session minutes of the May 15, 2017 meeting of the Retirement Board of the Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island.**

Mr. Dion said although there was not anything inaccurate in the minutes, he felt they were incomplete as there was no commentary of what the questions were both with the State Investment Commission's(SIC's) and the Retirement Board's minutes.

Treasurer Magaziner asked what amendments Mr. Dion would offer, and Mr. Dion stated that details relating to the discussion of rates of return, inflation assumption, wage and salary assumptions were not noted in the minutes, but were discussed at the Board meeting. The Treasurer affirmed to the Board that its feedback has been to condense the minutes since previous minutes appeared unnecessarily granular, but recognized that due to the importance of the previous month's conversation, a more detailed version of the minutes could be prepared.

Board Counsel Michael P. Robinson provided some legal parameters to the Board as to what must be included in the minutes at a minimum.

Mr. DiBiase, Mr. Daniels and Mr. Boudreau agreed with Mr. Dion's comments. Ms. Monte suggested if a Board member wants a specific discussion or line of questioning to be documented in the minutes, then he or she should so signify.

On a motion by Paul L. Dion, Ph.D., and seconded by Roger P. Boudreau it was suggested to strike the word "somewhat" after the words "increased costs" on page 4 of the May 15, 2017 Board minutes second paragraph from the bottom of the page to read: *This plan*

would reduce the near-term budget impact of the assumption change and increase costs over the full term of each new amortization period. It was unanimously

On a motion by Roger P. Boudreau and seconded by Paul L. Dion, Ph.D., it was unanimously

**VOTED: To approve and post the May 15, 2017 Retirement Board Minutes as a “draft”, but to prepare a revised and extended version of the May 15, 2017 minutes to be considered at the next meeting for approval by the Board.**

### **III. Chairperson’s Report**

Treasurer Magaziner apprised the Board that he would update them with some legislative activity after the Directors report.

### **IV. Executive Director’s Report**

Director Karpinski apprised the Board that the Administration, Audit, Risk and Compliance Subcommittee will be meeting after this meeting to consider electronic Board books with 2 vendors providing live test demonstrations. The Director said Chairman Mullaney will update the Board regarding the subcommittee’s last meeting on May 25, 2017.

Director Karpinski apprised the Board they are in possession of the monthly Pension Application Report and the June 9, 2017 Disability Subcommittee Report.

Director Karpinski then updated the Board on the revised “*Report of Contributions*” delinquency report for MERS. The Director said The Town of Foster, Foster Police Department, City of East Providence and Warren Housing Authority are all current. The Director also said that the Executive Director of the Newport Housing Authority is authorizing a payment today, so they will then be considered current. The remaining two agencies, namely, Hope Valley-Wyoming Fire District and Union Fire District (NC) are still outstanding, and they have been contacted to have the data posted. Consistent with procedure, Board Counsel Robinson will send an official notice if no payment is made shortly.

Director Karpinski then updated the Board on the “*Report of Contributions*” delinquency report for ERS regarding the RI Airport Corporation and Sheila C. Nowell Leadership Academy are both current.

Director Karpinski apprised the Board that both the Governance and Administration, Audit, Risk and Compliance Subcommittees will meet on July 12, 2017.

Director Karpinski apprised the Board that on the *ERSRI New Retiree Report for May 2017*, State Police Colonel Ann Assumpico was inadvertently listed as a retiree resulting from a data error.

Treasurer Magaziner said the legislative session is ending soon so he is monitoring any retirement legislation. He said requests have come in for actuarial analyses to assess the costs for different bills. The Treasurer said there is one bill scheduled for a vote which has been previously submitted, and he anticipates it being passed on this submission. It

is a bill that would allow retired nurses to teach at the colleges and universities to work up to 75/150 days before suspension of their pension benefit, rather than current limit of earning \$15,000. An actuarial analysis by GRS noted that the fiscal impact of this Bill is immaterial. Also, the Treasurer said there is some movement on a bill to increase the Teacher Survivor Benefit in the TSB plan. He said it provides for a 10% increase to the benefit which would bring the funding level of the plan from 140% to 125%. The Treasurer said an actuarial analysis of this legislation was provided to the General Assembly and that because the plan is overfunded and that there has not been any adjustment in quite some time, he believes the proposed change to be reasonable.

Mr. Dion questioned the change from \$15,000 gross income to a 75-full day/150 half day. Treasurer Magaziner said there are very few people this would affect, and any change to the employer contribution rate would be immaterial. Mr. Dion questioned the equity of this bill and felt it segregates other State employees who are prohibited from working at the colleges/universities. Mr. DiBiase said the Governor's administration put in a letter of opposition to this bill.

Ms. Reback said part of the Republican finance plan is to lower the benefits of disability retirements and that the Speaker of the House Mattiello is interested in the bill. Ms. Reback had concerns about lowering benefits, especially of disabilities and said that this should not be supported. She asked Treasurer Magaziner to relay this message to the appropriate members of the House and Senate. The Treasurer said he has not seen any specific proposal nor has he seen any request for an actuarial analysis. Treasurer Magaziner said he opposes any pension-related bill unless there is an actuarial study requested and performed. The Treasurer said an inquiry can be sent to the Speaker of the House, and if there is any significant development he will inform the Board.

Mr. Maguire asked Director Karpinski who affirmed that those districts with delinquent contributions are current with the Defined Contributions to TIAA. Mr. Maguire also asked Treasurer Magaziner regarding legislation that would allow a disability applicant denied by the Board the right to an appeal in the Worker's Compensation Court, with a *de novo* review. The Treasurer said he had a conversation with the Chair of the Workers Compensation (WC) advisory committee and the Chief Judge of WC Court on this matter. He reported that they intend to take that language out of their omnibus bill this year, realizing that issues relating to disability pensions are complicated and they want to work with the System to study it before making any changes.

## V. **Administrative Decisions**

### **Diane M. Bruno vs. ERSRI**

Included in Board Members' Books, under separate cover, were the Findings of Fact as concluded by the Disability Subcommittee, transcripts from the appeal to the subcommittee, medical and supporting information in the matter of *Diane M. Bruno vs. ERSRI*. Attorney Robinson asked if consistent with Regulation Number 9, *Rules of Practice for Hearings*, there were any written briefs, legal memoranda, or exceptions to the conclusions and recommendation of the Disability Subcommittee. Director Karpinski apprised the Board there was, and that such material was included in the Board members' books. He referred to a memo included in the board book that noted while this information was received 10 days prior to the hearing, it is new information that was not considered by the Disability Subcommittee in Ms. Bruno's appeal hearing on February 8, 2017.

Attorney Robinson then said that pursuant to ERSRI's regulations, each party to the proceeding has the right to appear and to make oral arguments before the Retirement Board. Consistent with the Board's long standing policy, he apprised Ms. Bruno that this is not an opportunity to present new factual material or evidence to the Board, and that pursuant to ERSRI's regulations and Rhode Island case law, the Board owes deference to the Disability Subcommittee on factual determinations and questions of credibility, and will not overturn those determinations of fact or credibility unless such determinations are found to be clearly wrong. Attorney Robinson noted for the record that Ms. Bruno was represented by legal counsel, Attorney Stephen M. Rappoport, who will speak on her behalf. There being a stenographer present, the parties presented their cases.

Mr. Rondeau left the meeting at 11:15 a.m.

At the conclusion of the hearing, a motion was made by Ms. Reback and seconded by Mr. Maguire to remand the matter of *Diane M. Bruno vs. ERSRI* to the Disability Subcommittee for 3 additional independent medical examinations (IME'S), where at least one IME would be a psychiatrist and at least one would be a rheumatologist.

A roll call was taken, and the following members voted Yea: General Treasurer Seth Magaziner; William B. Finelli; Roger P. Boudreau; Brian M. Daniels; Michael DiBiase; Paul L. Dion, Ph.D.; Thomas M. Lambert; John P. Maguire; Marianne M. Monte; Thomas A. Mullaney; Claire M. Newell; Marcia B. Reback and Dr. Laura Shawhughes.

There being 14 votes cast, 14 voted in the affirmative and none in the negative consistent with Rhode Island General Laws §36-8-6, *Votes of the Board -- Record of Proceedings*, and there being a quorum present, it was then:

Lincourt, wherein Attorney Robinson said the Judge affirmed the Retirement board's denial of an accidental disability pension application stemming from a 2010 injury.

Attorney Robinson said Mr. Lincourt appealed to Superior Court, and Judge Taft-Carter fully upheld the Retirement Board's decision.

## VIII. Committee Reports

### Administration, Audit, Risk and Compliance

Chairman Mullaney said demonstrations of digital Board book vendors were presented at the Subcommittee's May 25, 2017 meeting and will be continued immediately after this morning's meeting scheduled for 11:00 a.m. Chairman Mullaney apprised the Board that there were 5 vendors who replied to the RFP, which then was narrowed down to 3 vendors; one was bought out by another so it narrowed it down to 2 vendors for consideration. Chairman Mullaney said one vendor is twice as expensive as the other vendor, so the Subcommittee would like to question if their services are worth the extra cost. Chairman Mullaney said the annual costs of approximately \$28,000 for the printing/production of both the Board and State Investment Commission's books were provided to the subcommittee so they could analyze the total cost to the system.

Non-substitute teacher positions must be certified by the school as posted but unable to be filled with a non-retiree. Depending on the position being filled, a retired employee who returned to work as a substitute teacher is indicated by a *Title/Function* column as *PRSB*.

If a retired employee is returning to work as an administrator, guidance counselor, or other certified position in a school department, this is considered a vacancy position and labeled in the *Title/Function* column as *PRAM*. Certification letters (good faith letter) need to be provided by the agency and forwarded to ERSRI consistent with RIGL §16-16-24.

Municipal retirees returning to work in a school system are indicated in the *Title/Function* column as *PRMS*. Municipal retirees returning to work for a participating city/town are indicated as *PRME*. Retirees working for a State College/University and allowed to earn up to \$15,000 gross yearly is indicated by *PRST* and for registered nurses working in a State facility indicated as *PRNR*.

Persons exceeding the statutory limitations are notified by mail or email and provided an opportunity to dispute the reports received by this office, prior to 'docking' or suspension of their benefit.

**I. MATTERS WITH PROCEDURAL OR SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES**

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**Timothy Koback v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Workers' Compensation Court; No. 201607082**

**Change.** Timothy Koback, a Woonsocket firefighter, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension pursuant to R.I.G.L. §45-21.2-9 to the Workers' Compensation Court. ERSRI has filed the designation of record with the court. The Woonsocket Human Resources Director has been deposed, and the matter has been scheduled for a status conference on May 23, 2017. The applicant's initial petition for benefits was denied, and a claim for trial taken. **An initial conference for the purposes of identifying trial evidence was conducted on June 13. Trial has been scheduled for August 2.**

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**Damon Borrelli v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island (ERSRI).**

**Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC-2016-2817**

**Change.** Plaintiff, a South Kingstown Police Officer, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension. ERSRI has filed an Answer to Mr. Borelli's First Amended Complaint, and the Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal with the court. **The Town of South Kingstown filed a motion to intervene in the action, which motion was granted. The parties are in the process of working out a briefing schedule.**

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**Linda Acciardo v. Employee's Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 10-2822**

**Change.** This action arises out of the denial by the Retirement Board of Ms. Acciardo's application for accidental disability retirement. Ms. Acciardo was a Chief Inspector for the R.I. Department of Health. An Answer was filed on May 19, 2010. The Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal was filed on June 17, 2010. On August 24, 2012, Mr. Justice Van Couyghen remanded the matter to the Retirement Board for further proceedings. On July 9, 2014, the Retirement Board denied Ms. Acciardo's application. On July 28, 2014, Ms. Acciardo filed a second appeal to the Superior Court. On February 17, 2017, the Court (Van Couyghen, J.) issued a decision affirming the Retirement Board's decision. Ms. Acciardo has filed a motion to reconsider. Judge Van Couyghen issued an Order denying the motion to reconsider. **Ms. Acciardo filed a petition for issuance of a writ of certiorari seeking review by the Rhode Island Supreme Court.**

**Retirement Board v. Ambulai Sheku**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.**

**New action. This is an action to revoke or reduce Mr. Sheku's pension pursuant to the Public Employee Pension Revocation and Reduction Act. Mr. Sheku, a former employee of the Rhode Island Department of Labor and Training, pled guilty to charges of conspiracy to commit mail fraud, theft of government funds, and accessing a protected computer to commit fraud, all in connection with his public employment. The lawsuit is in the process of being served on Mr. Sheku.**

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**Robert L. Lincourt vs. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Providence County Superior Court; C.A. No. PC2015-0602**

**Change.** Plaintiff, a North Providence firefighter, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension. The System's Answer and the Designation of Administrative Record have been filed with the Court. Mr. Lincourt has filed a motion to remand the action to the Retirement Board for the presentation of additional evidence. On July 18, 2016, Judge Taft-Carter issued a decision denying Mr. Lincourt's motion to remand. **On June 6, 2017, Judge Taft-Carter issued a decision upholding the Retirement Board's denial of Mr. Lincourt's accidental disability application.**

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**II. MATTERS WITH NO PROCEDURAL OR SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES**

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**Mitchell Adams, Frank Andre, Eric Bazzle, Stephen Bishop, James Bomba, Gerald Capaldi, Robert Cardin, Anthony Ceprano, David DiIorio, James P. Grande, Sr., Robert Morrissey, Douglas Randall, Anthony Rossi, Kenneth Scandariato, David Vartian, John Wheeler, and Andrew Zarlenga v. The Town of North Providence, by and through its Director of Public Safety and Mayor, Charles Lombardi, and the Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island, By and through its Executive Director, Frank Karpinski**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.**

**No Change.** Plaintiffs are retired North Providence firefighters, who are seeking a declaratory judgment that they are entitled to have their benefits calculated based upon longevity payments which include overtime pay as a component. The Complaint has been served on ERSRI.

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**Kevin Lang v. ERSRI; Workers' Compensation Court; WCC No. 201504163**

**No Change.** Kevin Lang, a Cranston firefighter, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension pursuant to R.I.G.L. §45-21.2-9. A pre-trial conference took place on October 28, 2015, at which time the Court denied Mr. Lang's petition for benefits. Mr. Lang

thereafter claimed a trial with regard to this decision. On September 9, 2016, the Court issued a decree and decision overturning the Retirement Board, and awarding accidental disability benefits to Mr. Lang, and a counsel fee to his attorney. The Retirement Board has filed a notice of appeal. Oral argument took place before the appellate division of the Workers' Compensation Court on April 5, 2017, and is under advisement.

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**Mary Zayat v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Providence County Superior Court CA No. 2012-0716**

No Change. This Administrative Appeal arises from Mary Zayat's claims that ERSRI wrongfully denied her application for an accidental disability pension. Ms. Zayat was a Probation and Parole Counselor with the Department of Corrections. The Retirement System's Answer was filed on February 22, 2012. The Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal was filed on February 23, 2012. Ms. Zayat has passed away, and counsel for the parties are discussing the status of the continued litigation.

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**Wayne Cushman v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island and the City of Cranston**

**Providence County Superior Court; PC2017-1727**

No Change. Plaintiff, a Cranston police officer, is challenging a decision of the Retirement Board to deny his application for an accidental disability pension. We are in the process of coordinating service of process.

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**Robert Perfetto v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Providence County Superior Court; PC2017-1767**

No Change. Plaintiff, a former employee of the State of Rhode Island, challenges the Retirement System's decision not to include a lump sum payment he had received in settlement of a lawsuit, in calculating his retirement benefits. Service has been effectuated.

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**Sandra Tiernan v. Frank Caprio *et al.***

**Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 09-7242**

No Change. This declaratory judgment action arises out of the setoff of workers compensation benefits from disability pension benefits. A Stipulation was filed on January 27, 2010 in the administrative appeal prematurely filed with the Superior Court, postponing the filing of an Answer and the Administrative Record pending the conclusion of the administrative proceedings. The Retirement Board has affirmed the administrative actions taken by the



Executive Director. Ms. Tiernan filed a motion to amend her complaint to include a claim based on an administrative appeal under the Administrative Procedures Act. The motion to amend was granted, and the Retirement Board filed an answer to the amended complaint. Ms. Tiernan subsequently was allowed to amend her complaint a second time, to include a claim based on estoppel. The parties are in the process of briefing the issues.

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**Linda Resnick v. Retirement Board of the Employees Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC-2017-1008**

No Change. Plaintiff challenges the Retirement Board's decision to deny her request for attorneys' fees pursuant to the Equal Access to Justice for Small Businesses and Individuals Act, in connection with her administrative appeal of a Retirement Board decision related to certain post-retirement employment. The parties are in the process of briefing the issues.

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**Retirement Board v. Fred Randall**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC15-0203**

No Change. This is an action to revoke or reduce Mr. Randall's pension pursuant to the Public Employee Pension Revocation and Reduction Act. Mr. Randall, a former employee of the University of Rhode Island, pled *nolo contendere* to a charge of conversion by a state employee. A hearing wherein Mr. Randall was required to appear and show cause why his pension benefits should not be suspended pending adjudication of the merits of the action took place on March 2, 2014. The Court determined that cause was not shown by Mr. Randall, and ordered that his pension benefits be immediately suspended pending adjudication of the action on the merits. An evidentiary hearing was conducted on July 7, 2016 at 2:00 PM. The court has issued a decision revoking Mr. Randall's pension in full, and awarding Mrs. Randall \$350.00 per month from the date of trial through December 31, 2016, and \$1,667.00 per month from January 1, 2017 until December 31, 2026 as an innocent spouse, conditioned upon her paying said sums over to URI to satisfy Mr. Randall's restitution payments. The court ruled that thereafter, once the restitution obligations have been satisfied, she should receive \$500.00 per month. The parties are in the process of seeking a conference with the court to clarify certain aspects of the court's order.

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**John R. Grasso v. Gina M. Raimondo, et al.**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.: PC 2013-3121**

No Change. Plaintiff is a disability retiree who brought this action against the Retirement System, the General Treasurer in her individual and official capacities, and the Executive Director in his individual and official capacities, seeking damages, and a determination that the Retirement System cannot require him to undergo an annual medical examination, or make adjustments to his disability allowance based on earned income. In a simultaneous

administrative proceeding, on September 10, 2014 the Retirement Board affirmed the Hearing Officer's decision upholding the administrative actions of the Executive Director. On October 8, 2014, Mr. Grasso appealed the Board's decision to the Superior Court, and by agreement of the parties the City of Cranston intervened in the action. On November 5, 2015, the Superior Court issued a declaratory judgment that the System cannot require Mr. Grasso to undergo annual medical examinations, or adjust his pension based on outside earnings. The System has filed a Notice of Appeal, and a Petition for Issuance of a Writ of Certiorari with the Rhode Island Supreme Court. The Rhode Island Supreme Court has granted certiorari, and assigned the matter for full briefing.

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**Margaret Provoyeur v. Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island.**

**Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC 2015-2609**

No Change. Plaintiff, a Providence school teacher, appeals the denial of her application for an accidental disability pension. On August 24, 2016, Plaintiff filed a motion to remand the matter to the Disability Subcommittee for the consideration of additional evidence. ERSRI filed an objection, and on October 28, 2016, the Superior Court denied the motion to remand.

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**The Retirement Board of the Municipal Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island v. Coventry Fire District, By and Through Frank Palin, John D'Onofrio, Brenda Rapose, and John Cook, in their Capacities as Board Members and Inhabitants of the District, Robert Catalfamo, in his Capacity as Tax Assessor/Collector of the District, and David Krekorian, in his Capacity as Treasurer of the District.**

**Kent County Superior Court; C.A. No. KC2015-1099**

No Change. Plaintiff brings this action seeking to collect unpaid employer and employee contributions to MERS. Defendant has not answered the case, but is seeking verification of the amount of the indebtedness.

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**Jeanne Rossi v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 09-2607**

No Change. This action arises out of the denial by the Retirement System of Ms. Rossi's application for attorney's fees pursuant to the Equal Access to Justice Act, related to the earlier denial of her application for an accidental disability pension. The Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal has been filed with the Court. The matter has been fully briefed and assigned to Mr. Justice Rubine for decision.

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**Jane Robinson v. Frank J. Karpinski in his capacity as Executive Director of the Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 09-7019**

No Change. This action arises out of the denial by the Retirement System of Ms. Robinson's request to purchase service credit for time when she left teaching for maternity reasons. An Answer was filed. The Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal was filed on April 14, 2010. This matter has been fully briefed and assigned to Ms. Justice Hurst for decision.

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**Nancy Langlois v. Frank T. Caprio**

**Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 10-0909**

No Change. This action arises out of the denial by the Retirement Board of Ms. Langlois's application to receive service credit for the time she worked reduced hours after she returned from maternity leave. An Answer and the Designation of the Administrative Record have been filed. On April 26, 2012, Mr. Justice Procaccini remanded the case to the Retirement Board for further proceedings. The matter was referred to the Hearing Officer for further consideration consistent with the April 26, 2012 decision. On October 24, 2012, the Hearing Officer issued a decision again affirming the administrative decision to deny Ms. Langlois's application to receive service credit. On December 12, 2012, the Retirement Board again voted to deny Ms. Langlois's request to obtain service credit. On January 21, 2013, Ms. Langlois filed a First Amended Complaint. The Retirement System's Answer and Amended Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal were filed on January 25, 2013.

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**Jennifer Leyden v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Providence County Superior Court CA No. 2012-1867**

No Change. This Administrative Appeal arises from Jennifer Leyden's claims that ERSRI wrongfully denied her application for an accidental disability pension. Ms. Leyden was a teacher for the Providence Public School System. The Retirement System's Answer was filed on June 4, 2012. The Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal was filed on June 5, 2012. The matter was fully briefed and assigned to Mr. Justice Lanphear for decision. On June 5, 2013, Judge Lanphear issued a decision remanding the matter to the Retirement Board for further proceedings. On July 17, 2013, ERSRI filed a petition for issuance of a writ of certiorari with the Rhode Island Supreme Court. On June 11, 2014, the Rhode Island Supreme Court issued an order denying the petition for certiorari as a final judgment has not yet entered. Ms. Leyden filed a motion with the Superior Court attempting to restrict the system's ability to obtain an additional independent medical examination. On October 17, 2014, the Superior Court denied Ms. Leyden's motion.

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**Peter Ferraro v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Washington County Superior Court CA No. 12-0674**

No Change. Plaintiff, a Westerly school teacher, appeals the denial of his application for an ordinary disability pension. The Retirement System has filed an Answer and the Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal with the Court. The matter has been fully briefed.

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**Michael T. Brady v. Gina M. Raimondo, et al.**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.: PC 2013-5592**

No Change. Plaintiff is a disability retiree who brought this action against the Retirement System, the General Treasurer in her individual and official capacities, and the Executive Director in his individual and official capacities, seeking, *inter alia*, damages, and a determination that the Retirement System cannot make adjustments to his disability allowance based on earned income. The parties have stipulated that the Superior Court action will be held in abeyance while Plaintiff pursues administrative remedies.

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**Albert DelMastro, Jr. v. Employee's Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC14-1850**

No Change. Plaintiff, an electrician with the Community College of Rhode Island, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension. The Retirement System has filed an Answer and the Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal with the Court.

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**Retirement Board v. Rachel Arruda**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC14-6174**

No Change. This is an action to revoke or reduce Ms. Arruda's pension pursuant to the Public Employee Pension Revocation and Reduction Act. Ms. Arruda, a former employee of the City of Woonsocket, pled *nolo contendere* to a felony charge related to conversion of funds in connection with her municipal employment. At a hearing on January 29, 2015, Arruda stipulated to the suspension of her pension pending adjudication of the action.

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**The Retirement Board of the Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island v. Gerard M. Martineau**

**Providence County Superior Court; C.A. No. PC 15-1268**

No Change. This is an action to revoke or reduce Mr. Martineau's pension pursuant to the Public Employee Pension Revocation and Reduction Act. Mr. Martineau, a former elected official of the State of Rhode Island, pled *nolo contendere* to charges of Honest Services Mail Fraud in connection with his public employment. Mr. Martineau was served with the Complaint on April 2, 2015. Mr. Martineau has agreed to voluntarily relinquish any entitlement to a pension or other benefit he might otherwise have been entitled to, and documents necessary to obtain court approval of revocation of his pension have been sent to him for review.

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**Benjamin Zanni v. Town of Johnston and ERSRI**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC-2015-4245**

No Change. Plaintiff brought suit against the Town of Johnston and ERSRI (as an “interested party”), challenging the City’s decision to deny him medical benefits pursuant to ordinance, based on his prior criminal conviction for conduct in connection with his public employment. The matter was initially removed by the City to federal court, and was then remanded to the superior court. ERSRI has filed an Answer to the Complaint.

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**Robert E. Falvey v. Seth Magaziner, et al.**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.: PC 2016-0232**

No Change. Plaintiff is a disability retiree who brought this action against the Retirement Board, the General Treasurer in his capacity as chair of the Board, the Executive Director, and the State of Rhode Island, seeking, *inter alia*, damages, and a determination that the Retirement System cannot make adjustments to his disability allowance based on earned income. The parties have stipulated that no Answer or other response shall be required to be filed until 30 days after Plaintiff’s counsel states in writing that an Answer or other response is being requested.

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**Benita Fernandez v. Employee’s Retirement System of Rhode Island**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC2015-5489**

No Change. Plaintiff, a Social Caseworker II with DCYF, appeals the denial of her application for an accidental disability pension. The Retirement System has filed an Answer and the Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal with the Court.

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**Anne Marcaccio v. Central Falls Board of Trustees, and its Members, Anna Cano Morales, Sonia Grace, Hugo Figueroa, Stephanie Gonzalez, Diosa Martinez, Ana Cecilia Rosado, and Ronald Pitt, the North Smithfield School Committee, and its Members, Merredythe Nadeau, Arthur Bassett, Michael Clifford, William J. O’Connell, Liane M. Jalette, James**

**J. Lombardi, III, and John E. Raymond and the Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island, by and through the General Treasurer, Seth Magaziner.**

**Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC 16-1210**

No Change. Plaintiff has brought this declaratory judgment action, with the stated intention of obtaining records from her former employers for use in connection with administrative proceedings at ERSRI related to the calculation of service credit, and her corresponding eligibility for a service pension. ERSRI has filed an answer to the complaint.

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**Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island v. Thomas McSoley, Marlene A. Palumbo, and Michael E. McSoley.**

**Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC2016-1144**

No Change. ERSRI brought suit to recover monies overpaid to a direct deposit account of Thomas McSoley, following his death in 2011. The defendants are believed to be joint account holders with the decedent. ERSRI effectuated service of process, and sought an injunction preventing the defendants from accessing or withdrawing the funds. On March 18, 2016, the parties entered into a Consent Order that restrains the defendants from accessing, withdrawing, encumbering, or otherwise spending or disposing of the funds on account until further order of the Court.

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**Alfred Benjamin v. Seth Magaziner, et al.**

**Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.: PC 2016-4467**

No Change. Plaintiff is a disability retiree who brought this action against the Retirement Board, the General Treasurer in his capacity as chair of the Board, the Executive Director, and the State of Rhode Island, seeking, *inter alia*, damages, and a determination that the Retirement System cannot make adjustments to his disability allowance based on earned income. The parties have stipulated that no Answer or other response shall be required to be filed until 30 days after Plaintiff's counsel states in writing that an Answer or other response is being requested.

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**Emile E. Ziadeh v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island Board.**

**Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC 2016-4629**

No Change. Plaintiff, a former state employee, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension. The parties are in the process of briefing the issues on appeal.

Recognizing a quorum, Chairman Mullaney called the meeting to order.

Mr. Rondeau arrived at 11:58 a.m.

**II. Approval of the Draft Minutes from the May 25, 2017 Administration, Audit, Risk and Compliance Subcommittee Meeting**

On a motion by Paul L. Dion, Ph.D., and seconded by Kelly Rogers, it was unanimously

**VOTED: To approve the draft regular minutes of the May 25, 2017 meeting of the ERSRI Administration, Audit, Risk and Compliance Subcommittee.**

**III. Vendor Demonstrations for Electronic Board Books Software and Recommendation to Full Board**

Chairman Mullaney asked Director Karpinski to provide the Subcommittee the total cost in producing the monthly books of the Retirement Board and the State Investment Commission. Director Karpinski provided a cost sheet indicating the monthly and annual cost figures comprised of labor, paper usage, copier usage to shipping indicating a total cost yearly of \$28,435.13.

All members had their laptops or tablets with an actual test board book prepared that was loaded to Convene and Diligent's temporary sites with guest user access. The live testing began with Convene and Mr. Wes Crowder provided the demonstration by phone. Mr. Brian Cannone, regional sales director for Diligent Corporation, provided Diligent's demonstration, also by phone.

Committee members posed questions to both vendors on features of each product and spent time navigating and using the various features of each.

Director Karpinski informed the Committee that given the information that would be on either tool, ERSRI would need to install a security feature that in the event a laptop or iPad is lost or stolen, upon notification by the member, ERSRI would remotely erase the entire piece of hardware. He said this is a consideration of choosing either the members own laptop or be provided a separate iPad.

Chairman Mullaney asked for the Subcommittee's feedback of each vendor's preferred features. The search feature and the tab feature in the Diligent product ranked high. The Subcommittee said the group wide feature of location and the disclosure of who is involved in a meeting and the general view on the laptop were Convene's attributes, as well as their lower cost. Director Karpinski reminded the committee that it may ultimately use iPad, as opposed to personal laptops.

Mr. Dion recognized the challenges of going from hardcopy board books to electronic board books and felt given this is ERSRI's first venture to electronic board books, it may be prudent to select the lower cost vendor as he felt features from each product were reasonably similar.

After further discussion on the features and merits of both vendors, a motion was made by Paul L. Dion, Ph.D., and seconded by Claire M. Newell, and it was

**VOTED: To recommend Convene to the full Board for electronic Board Books.**

Jean Rondeau voted nay

#### **IV. Discussion and Prioritization of Subcommittee Duties**

Given the elapsed time, the discussion and prioritization of Subcommittee duties was postponed to the next meeting.

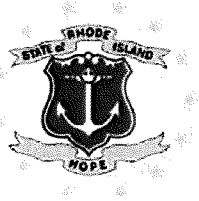

The Meeting of the Member Services Subcommittee was called to order at 9:05 a.m. Wednesday, June 14, 2017, in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor Conference Room, 50 Service Avenue, Warwick, RI.

**I. Roll Call of Members**

The following members were present at roll call: Marcia B. Reback, Chairperson; Patrick Marr for General Treasurer and Marianne F. Monte.

Also in attendance: Frank J. Karpinski, ERSRI Executive Director; Kate Brock, Assistant Executive Director and Zachary J. Saul, Chief Financial Officer

Recognizing a quorum, Chairperson Reback called the meeting to order.

Roger P. Boudreau arrived at 9:21 a.m.

**II. Approval of the Draft Meeting Minutes of the April 12, 2017 Member Services Subcommittee**

On a motion by Patrick Marr and seconded by Marianne F. Monte, it was unanimously **VOTED: To approve the draft regular minutes of the April 12, 2017 meeting of the ERSRI Member Services Subcommittee.**

**III. Presentations on Member Communications and Data Collection Process**

Chairperson Reback introduced Assistant Executive Director Kate Brock who provided a continuation of the overview, from the last meeting, on member communications. Ms. Brock noted that member communication is on ERSRI's website [www.ersri.org](http://www.ersri.org). She said the most frequently viewed pages were the "I'm a Member" and "I'm a Retiree", providing the FAQ's for explanations of a member's queries.

Ms. Brock apprised the Subcommittee that a retirement package is provided at the group sessions which also is available online and informed the Subcommittee that generally 6 group sessions are provided monthly consisting of State, Teachers and Municipal Employees. Ms. Brock said that benefit information is provided in detail as well as a benefit estimate. Ms. Brock also said that the member forms are also online and a "contact us email link" is on the main page on the ERSRI website. She also noted that there is a link to obtain investment access information which is uploaded monthly.

Ms. Brock discussed the *COMPASS* newsletter with a new layout. She said there has been an increase of the investment information as recommended by Treasurer Magaziner to be included in the newsletter. Part of the new layout is incorporating retiree profile stories to catch the member's eye while recognizing accolades of members' work. Ms. Reback said we should be conscious of the newsletter containing

campaign style literature and or connotations. Ms. Brock said there is a collaborative effort by Evan England, Director of Communications and Randy Rice, Deputy Communications Director and then collaborating with Director Karpinski, Mr. Saul and Ms. Brock to develop the content and then each article will be assigned to a specific person for drafting.

Ms. Brock then logged into the ERSRI website to present the features to the committee. She said the *Retiree Portal* and has an *Administration Portal* which allows both the member and staff member to view the same page. She noted a member can view their pay stubs and 1099's as well as update the profile of personal information. Ms. Brock also said there is the *Pension Profile Tool* that has personal information on file such as beneficiary information and running totals of post-retirement employment information.

Ms. Brock apprised the Subcommittee that a link is provided to obtain information on the *My TIAA* page to view one's Defined Contribution Plan's profile and a *Buyback Tool* estimator with a link to reach out to ERSRI if purchasing is a consideration.

Ms. Brock said the *View My Pension Profile* is frequently used with the *Projection Tool*. She said if any discrepancies appear to members, it allows them to contact ERSRI to contact the employer to see if accurate data input is happening. She also noted that documents which are generated by ERSRI are for viewing only and not incoming documents relative to a member's account.

Ms. Brock concluded her presentation and introduced Mr. Zachary Saul, Chief Financial Officer.

Mr. Saul provided a presentation on ERSRI Wage and Contribution process and introduced Ms. Cheryl DerHagopian, ERSRI's Business Analyst. He apprised the Subcommittee that ERSRI manages data for 240 individual employer groups, where some cities/towns have 6 or 7 groups each. Mr. Saul said the Wage and Contribution group is responsible for reconciliation and posting of member salary and pension contribution information. He also said this group provides technical support and education to employer units utilizing ERSRI's data transmission portal. Also, this group is responsible for transmission of data to external parties.

Mr. Saul discussed the *Employer Portal* noting that it is real time so payroll coordinators will know if their data is posted correctly. He noted there are levels of validation of data submissions on every data transmission ensuring that the "format" of the transmission satisfies validations rules, files must be 100% valid before they can be posted to member accounts.

Mr. Saul apprised the Subcommittee that there are 3 different data submission options; a flat file record layout, which is most widely used with large employers, a manual template for upload (.csv file) for small employers where employers have minimal payroll fluctuation and data manually entered to database, commonly used for specific data transactions (e.g. adjustments).

Mr. Saul said his group offers webinars online and "go-to-meetings" for employers' assistance, sharing screens to walk the employer through the process which Ms. DerHagopian leads.

Regarding data validation, Mr. Saul said there are 2 types of employer audits done. One being a financial audit done by the Auditor General's Office and another is done by the external auditors which involves random sampling of data and employment records at municipal and teaching units.

Mr. Saul concluded his presentation.

#### **IV. Discussion and Prioritization of Subcommittee Duties**

The Subcommittee agreed to discuss and prioritize its duties at the next scheduled meeting in October 2017.

#### **V. Adjournment**

There being no other business to come before the committee, on a motion by Marianne F. Monte and seconded by Roger P. Boudreau, the meeting adjourned at 10:05 a.m.
