We write in response to your November 10, 2015 request for information pursuant to the Rhode Island Access to Public Records Act (APRA). Your specific request is noted below along with our corresponding response.

I'm looking to see if there is a published list of written policies, such as the one attached [Retirement Contributions for Teacher Positions] and whether this specific policy has been updated since 2001.

The Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island does not have a list of policies. The policy attached to your request is the current policy and has not been updated since 2001.

If you contend you have been denied access to public records, pursuant to RIGL §38-2-8, you may appeal this decision to Frank J. Karpinski, Executive Director of the Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island, 50 Service Avenue, 2nd Floor, Warwick, RI 02886. You may also file a complaint with the Department of the Attorney General, 150 South Main Street, Providence, RI 02903 or the Rhode Island Superior Court of the county where the records are maintained.
