Dear Ms.

We write in response to your June 29, 2015 request for information pursuant to the Rhode Island Access to Public Records Act (APRA). Your specific request is noted below along with our corresponding response:

Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOLA) and your state's unclaimed property laws, I am requesting a list of all the unclaimed property that you may be holding, preferably in an electronic format. How often is the list updated? If there is any cost associated with obtaining this list, please let me know so that I can arrange payment.

A PDF of the most recent list of Names of Persons Appearing to be Owners of Abandoned Property can be found at the bottom of the Unclaimed Property page of Treasury's website at http://treasury.ri.gov/treasury-divisions/unclaimed-property/. This list is typically updated at least once annually.

If you contend you have been denied access to public records, pursuant to Rhode Island General Laws §38-2-8, you may appeal this decision to Jeffrey M. Padwa, General Counsel for the Rhode Island General Treasurer's Office, 50 Service Avenue, 2nd Floor, Warwick, RI 02886. You may also file a complaint with the Department of the Attorney General, 150 South Main Street, Providence, RI 02903 or the Rhode Island Superior Court of the county where the records are maintained.
