Employees' Retirement Board of Rhode Island Monthly Meeting Minutes Wednesday, July 11, 2018 9:00 a.m.

2nd Floor Conference Room, 50 Service Avenue

The Regularly Scheduled Meeting of the Retirement Board was called to order at 9:00 a.m., Wednesday, July 11, 2018 in the 2nd Floor Conference Room, 50 Service Avenue, Warwick, RI.

I. Roll Call of Members

The following members were present at roll call: General Treasurer Seth Magaziner; Roger P. Boudreau; Mark A. Carruolo; Brian M. Daniels; Michael DiBiase; Thomas M. Lambert; John P. Maguire; Thomas A. Mullaney; Claire M. Newell; Marcia B. Reback; Jean Rondeau; Dr. Laura Shawhughes and Lisa A. Whiting.

Paul L. Dion, Ph. D arrived at 9:26 a.m.

Also in attendance: Frank J. Karpinski, ERSRI Executive Director; Attorney Michael P. Robinson, Board Counsel.

Members absent were: Vice Chair William B. Finelli

Recognizing a quorum, Treasurer Magaziner called the meeting to order.

II. Approval of Minutes

On a motion duly made by John P. Maguire and seconded by Roger P. Boudreau it was unanimously

VOTED: To approve the minutes of the May 11, 2018 meeting of the Retirement Board of the Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island.

III. Chairman's Report

The Retirement Board received a Quarterly Update on the Investment Portfolio as of May 31, 2018 by CIO Alec Stais and a Defined Contribution Plan Update from TIAA by David Iden, Relationship Manager and Matthew DiCroce, Director of Institutional Investment Strategy.

IV. Executive Director's Report

The Director apprised the Board that Teacher benefit applications and information is being received by ERSRI and the staff is in good shape given the 500 additional benefit estimates done for the Voluntary Retirement Incentive (VRI). He noted that one retirement counselor retired under the VRI and subsequently, one counselor was promoted, and another staff member will replace the junior counselor.

Director Karpinski noted that as of the end of the legislative session, no legislation was enacted that affected ERSRI.

The Director said all subcommittees met over the prior two months and the respective chair will update the Board during committee reports.

V. Administrative Decisions

Rudolph J. Palumbo and Judith A. Palumbo vs. ERSRI

There being a stenographer present, Rudolph J. Palumbo and Judith A. Palumbo presented oral argument in opposition to the recommendation of Hearing Officer Raymond Marcaccio in this contested administrative appeal. Members of the Retirement Board questioned the appellants and discussed the administrative appeal. A motion was duly made by Jean Rondeau and seconded by Paul L. Dion, Ph.D.

A roll call was taken, and the following members voted Yea: General Treasurer Seth Magaziner; Mark A. Carruolo; Brian M. Daniels; Michael DiBiase; Paul L. Dion, Ph. D; Thomas M. Lambert; Thomas A. Mullaney; Jean Rondeau; Dr. Laura Shawhughes and Lisa A. Whiting. The following voted Nay: Roger P. Boudreau; John P. Maguire; Claire Newell and Marcia B. Reback.

There being 14 votes cast, 10 voted in the affirmative and 4 in the negative. Consistent with Rhode Island General Laws §36-8-6, Votes of the Board -- Record of Proceedings, and there being a quorum present, it was then:

VOTED: To uphold the hearing officer's recommendation that the matter is not currently ripe for determination.

A motion was then duly made by Paul L. Dion, Ph.D. and seconded by Roger P. Boudreau and it was unanimously

VOTED: To have the Governance Subcommittee take up the issue of Teachers' Survivors' Benefit (TSB) eligibility for spouses separated or divorced at its next meeting regularly scheduled or otherwise, but no later than the October 2018 meeting.

VI. Approval of the May and June Pensions as Presented by ERSRI

On a motion by John P. Maguire and seconded by Marcia B. Reback, it was unanimously **VOTED: To approve the May and June Pensions as presented.**

VII. Legal Counsel Report

Attorney Michael Robinson addressed a new Superior Court decision in the matter of *Sandra Tiernan vs. The Retirement System*. No votes were taken.

Administration Subcommittee

Chairman Mullaney said the Subcommittee met to consider various pending change control requests (CCRs) related to the Morneau Shepell Ariel System. On motion by Thomas A. Mullaney and seconded by Marcia B. Reback it was unanimously:

VOTED: To approve the total change control request (CCR) related to the Morneau Shepell Ariel System of \$109,100 with the cost of the specific items allocated to specific employers as follows: CCR 36 to the State system and CCR 33A and 35 to the Teachers' and MERS' systems.

Chairman Mullaney then motioned and it was seconded by Marcia B. Reback to:

Voted: Approve the expenditure of \$75,200 of the data cleansing project to be charged against the \$825,000 previously appropriated by the Retirement Board.

Governance and Member Services Subcommittee meetings

Chairman Maguire of the Governance Subcommittee apprised the Board that following extensive discussions and joint meetings of the Governance and Member Services Subcommittees, the Governance Subcommittee recommended retaining the existing regulation in place with regard to the effective date of retirement for teachers retiring at the end of the school year. The Member Services Subcommittee concurred in this recommendation. On a motion by John P. Maguire and seconded by Marcia B. Reback it was unanimously:

VOTED: To maintain the existing regulation in place with regard to the effective date of retirement for teachers retiring at the end of the school year.

Chairperson Reback apprised he Board that the Member Services Subcommittee further recommended that the Board promulgate a regulation to address eligibility for the annual COLA benefit adjustments for teachers who retire at the end of the school year, and that

the issue be remanded to the Governance Subcommittee for development of such a regulation. The Governance Subcommittee concurred in this recommendation. On motion by Marcia B. Reback and seconded by John P. Maguire it was unanimously

VOTED: To recommend that the Board promulgate a regulation to address eligibility for the annual COLA benefit adjustment for teachers who retire at the end of the school year, and that the issue be remanded to the Governance Subcommittee for development of such a regulation

Chairman Maguire then told the Board that the Governance subcommittee met on July 10th and discussed two potential regulations, one regarding retirement contributions for teacher positions and a regulation regarding membership and service credit. He said these will ultimately be brought before the Board with a recommendation for promulgation.

Chairperson Reback said the Member Services Subcommittee met on June 20th and discussed defined contribution counselling integration with the current defined benefit counselling.

IX. Adjournment

There being no other business to come before the Board, on a motion by Roger P. Boudreau and seconded by John P. Maguire, the meeting adjourned at 10:21 a.m.

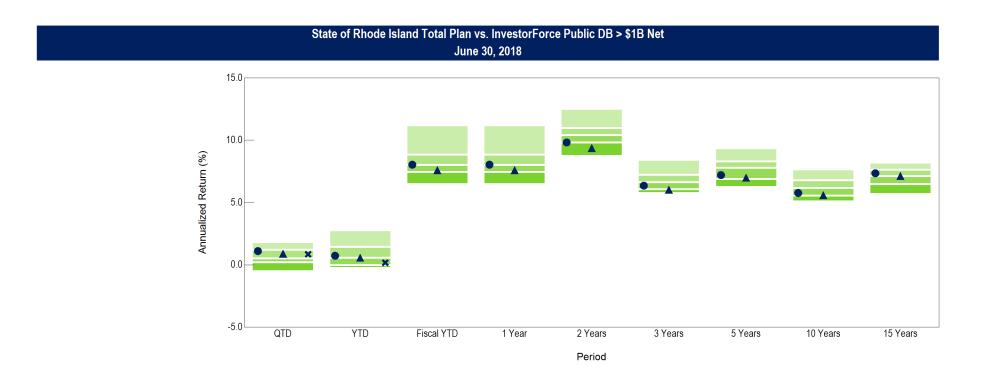

•R.I.G.L. 36-8-10.1:

- (a) There is hereby created a restricted receipt account, under the control of the general treasurer, the proceeds of which shall be used solely to pay the expenses of the retirement board, the cost of maintaining the retirement system, and the costs of administering the retirement system.
- b) There shall be transferred to this restricted receipt account seventeen and one-half (17.5) basis points (0.175%), where one hundred (100.0) basis points equals one percent (1.0%), of the average total investments before lending activities as reported in the annual report of the auditor general for the next preceding five fiscal years.

Any non-encumbered funds on June 30 of any fiscal year shall be credited to the employees' retirement system of the state of Rhode Island and to the municipal employees' retirement system of the state of Rhode Island in the same proportion as their contributions to the restricted receipt account established by this section during the fiscal year.

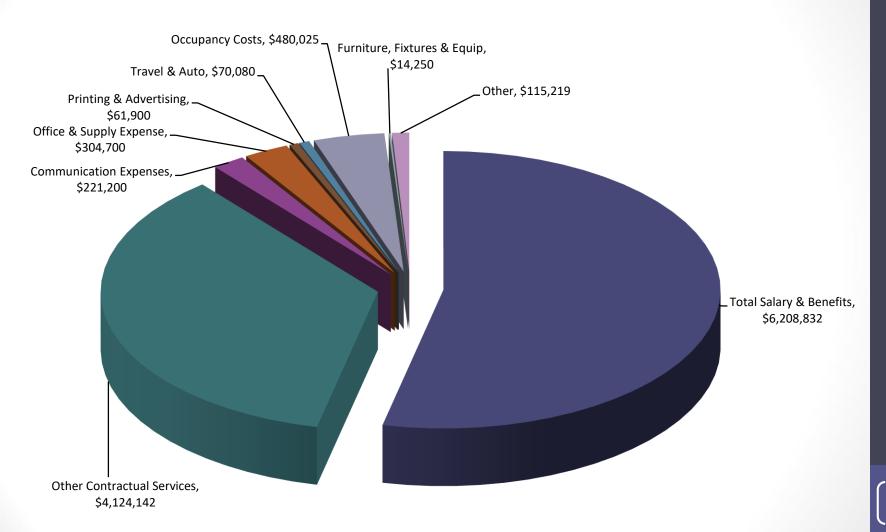

Data Validation Project Update

Goals:

- Achieve faster processing times for pension payments and validated eligibility and estimates.
- Reduce pension processing time from 2-3 months to 30 days from date of retirement.
- Members can get an accurate estimate of their future benefit on demand.

Strategy:

- Correct historic data at a population level and achieve 95% accurate member data.
- Identify data elements that prevent automation, then:
 - "Fix by script" where possible using IT resources
 - Hire temporary resources for manual remediation where no technology-based fix is feasible.

Data Validation Project Update

- Board approved an appropriation of \$850,000 in April 2017 to commence a data validation initiative.
- Hired a data analyst, SWS Technologies, in October of 2017 to work with ERSRI to analyze and identify data anomalies and potential data conversion issues.
- Analysis goes through six phases: Identify the potential data issue,
 Create Query to Determine the Population, Analyze the query output to
 refine results, Evaluate and determine remediation options, Remediate
 and Validate and confirm data correction.
- The analysis produced 64 items to resolve and 19 have been completed to date via computer script.
- To date, have expended \$72,500 on data changes and/or analysis for 15 topics from IT vendor and \$150,000 on SWS Technologies for analytics and computer data script development.

Data Validation Project

- ERSRI and SWS continues to analyze and remediate data electronically where applicable.
- However, some validations will require manual review/remediation.
- Based on development by SWS of issue identification tools, there are about 14,160 potential members that have records requiring manual validation.
- The effort will require temporary staffing to complete this task.
- ERSRI plans, in FY2019, onboard up to 8 temporary staff to begin training and account validation at an estimated cost of \$300,000.
- For the FY2020 budget, ERSRI would request approval in the budget of an additional \$250,000 for temporary staff to complete work on the identified population, and potentially to work on other subsequently identified populations.

EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM OF THE STATE OF RHODE ISLAND REPORT AS OF SEPTEMBER 2018

ON LITIGATED MATTERS FILED BY OR AGAINST ERSRI

I. MATTERS WITH PROCEDURAL OR SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES

City of Cranston v. International Brotherhood of Police Officers, Local 301 and Daniel W. Nuev, Sr.

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. 2017-2840

Change. Plaintiff seeks a declaratory judgment that Daniel Nuey, a Cranston firefighter, is unable to pursue a demand for arbitration under the applicable collective bargaining unit, as he had retired from his employment. Defendant Nuey has applied for, and been approved for an ordinary disability pension, although MERS has not yet received necessary employment separation documents. The Defendant labor union filed a motion to join MERS as an indispensable party, and/or a party whose rights may be affected by the declarations sought, which motion was granted by the court. After a bench trial in March of 2018, the Court determined that Nuey was not retired solely by virtue of having been approved for an ordinary disability pension, and that the matter could proceed to arbitration. The City has filed an appeal with the Rhode Island Supreme Court. The Supreme Court issued a stay with regard to the arbitration while the appeal is pending. The matter was also mediated in the Supreme Court, but did not resolve. The appellate litigation will continue.

Benjamin Zanni v. Town of Johnston and ERSRI

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC-2015-4245

Change. Plaintiff brought suit against the Town of Johnston and ERSRI (as an "interested party"), challenging the City's decision to deny him medical benefits pursuant to ordinance, based on his prior criminal conviction for conduct in connection with his public employment. The matter was initially removed by the City to federal court, and was then remanded to the superior court. ERSRI has filed an Answer to the Complaint. The Town has filed a Motion for Summary Judgment, and Plaintiff has filed a motion for a declaratory judgment.

Damon Borrelli v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island (ERSRI).

Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC-2016-2817

Change. Plaintiff, a South Kingstown Police Officer, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension. ERSRI has filed an Answer to Mr. Borelli's First Amended

Complaint, and the Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal with the court. The Town of South Kingstown filed a motion to intervene in the action, which motion was granted. On August 9, 2018, the Court (Lanphear, J.) issued a decision vacating the Retirement Board's decision and remanding the matter to ERSRI for further proceedings.

Sandra Tiernan v. Frank Caprio et al.

Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 09-7242

Change. This declaratory judgment action arises out of the setoff of workers compensation benefits from disability pension benefits. A Stipulation was filed on January 27, 2010 in the administrative appeal prematurely filed with the Superior Court, postponing the filing of an Answer and the Administrative Record pending the conclusion of the administrative proceedings. The Retirement Board has affirmed the administrative actions taken by the Executive Director. Ms. Tiernan filed a motion to amend her complaint to include a claim based on an administrative appeal under the Administrative Procedures Act. The motion to amend was granted, and the Retirement Board filed an answer to the amended complaint. Ms. Tiernan subsequently was allowed to amend her complaint a second time, to include a claim based on estoppel. The issues were fully briefed, and the matter was assigned to Ms. Justice Keough for decision. On July 10, 2018, the Court issued a decision on the agency appeal fully affirming the Retirement Board's decision. The parties have asked the Court to issue a supplemental decision addressing all of the counts of the complaint, in order for an appeal to be properly taken on a complete record.

II. MATTERS WITH NO PROCEDURAL OR SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES

Kevin Lang v. ERSRI; Workers' Compensation Court; WCC No. 201504163

No change. Kevin Lang, a Cranston firefighter, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension pursuant to R.I.G.L. §45-21.2-9. A pre-trial conference took place on October 28, 2015, at which time the Court denied Mr. Lang's petition for benefits. Mr. Lang thereafter claimed a trial with regard to this decision. On September 9, 2016, the Court issued a decree and decision overturning the Retirement Board, and awarding accidental disability benefits to Mr. Lang, and a counsel fee to his attorney. The Retirement Board filed a notice of appeal to the Appellate Division of the Workers' Compensation Court. On July 21, 2017, the Workers' Compensation Court Appellate Division issued a decision affirming the trial court, and awarding Mr. Lang an accidental disability pension. ERSRI filed a petition for a writ of certiorari with the Rhode Island Supreme Court, which has been granted. The parties are presently engaged in the Supreme Court pre-briefing process.

Retirement Board v. Fred Randall

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC15-0203

No change. This is an action to revoke or reduce Mr. Randall's pension pursuant to the Public Employee Pension Revocation and Reduction Act. Mr. Randall, a former employee of the University of Rhode Island, pled *nolo contendere* to a charge of conversion by a state employee. A hearing wherein Mr. Randall was required to appear and show cause why his pension benefits should not be suspended pending adjudication of the merits of the action took place on March 2, 2014. The Court determined that cause was not shown by Mr. Randall, and ordered that his pension benefits be immediately suspended pending adjudication of the action on the merits. An evidentiary hearing was conducted on July 7, 2016 at 2:00 PM. The court issued a decision revoking Mr. Randall's pension in full, and awarding Mrs. Randall \$350.00 per month from the date of trial through December 31, 2016, and \$1,667.00 per month from January 1, 2017 until December 31, 2026 as an innocent spouse, conditioned upon her paying said sums over to URI to satisfy Mr. Randall's restitution payments. The Court ruled that thereafter, once the restitution obligations have been satisfied, she should receive \$500.00 per month. The Court also ruled that no contributions shall be returned until the order of restitution has been satisfied. Mr. Randall has filed an appeal with the Rhode Island Supreme Court.

Timothy Koback v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island

Workers' Compensation Court; No. 201607082

No change. Timothy Koback, a Woonsocket firefighter, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension pursuant to R.I.G.L. §45-21.2-9 to the Workers' Compensation Court. ERSRI has filed the designation of record with the court. The Woonsocket Human Resources Director was deposed. The applicant's initial petition for benefits was denied, and a claim for trial taken. Trial was conducted on August 2, 2017, at which Mr. Koback testified. On February 8, 2018 the Court issued a decision granting Mr. Koback an accidental disability pension and indicating that a counsel fee would be awarded to Mr. Koback's counsel. On May 4, 2018, the Court issued a decree awarding a counsel fee to Mr. Koback's counsel. MERS has objected to the awarding of a counsel fee and has filed an appeal with the Appellate Division of the Workers' Compensation Court.

Retirement Board v. Ambulai Sheku

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.

No change. This is an action to revoke or reduce Mr. Sheku's pension pursuant to the Public Employee Pension Revocation and Reduction Act. Mr. Sheku, a former employee of the Rhode Island Department of Labor and Training, pled guilty to charges of conspiracy to commit mail fraud, theft of government funds, and accessing a protected computer to commit fraud, all in

connection with his public employment. Mr. Sheku has been defaulted for failure to respond to the complaint.

Wayne Cushman v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island and the City of Cranston

Providence County Superior Court; PC2017-1727

No change. Plaintiff, a Cranston police officer, is challenging a decision of the Retirement Board to deny his application for an accidental disability pension. ERSRI has filed an Answer and the Designation of Record with the Court.

Robert Perfetto v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island

Providence County Superior Court; PC2017-1767

No change. Plaintiff, a former employee of the State of Rhode Island, challenges the Retirement System's decision not to include a lump sum payment he had received in settlement of a lawsuit, in calculating his retirement benefits. Service has been effectuated. The Retirement System has filed an Answer and the Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal with the Court. The matter has been fully briefed and assigned for decision.

Margaret Provoyeur v. Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island.

Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC 2015-2609

No change. Plaintiff, a Providence school teacher, appeals the denial of her application for an accidental disability pension. On August 24, 2016, Plaintiff filed a motion to remand the matter to the Disability Subcommittee for the consideration of additional evidence. ERSRI filed an objection, and on October 28, 2016, the Superior Court denied the motion to remand.

The Retirement Board of the Municipal Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island v. Coventry Fire District, By and Through Frank Palin, John D'Onofrio, Brenda Rapose, and John Cook, in their Capacities as Board Members and Inhabitants of the District, Robert Catalfamo, in his Capacity as Tax Assessor/Collector of the District, and David Krekorian, in his Capacity as Treasurer of the District.

Kent County Superior Court; C.A. No. KC2015-1099

No change. Plaintiff brings this action seeking to collect unpaid employer and employee contributions to MERS. Defendant has not answered the case, but is seeking verification of the amount of the indebtedness.

Jeanne Rossi v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island

Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 09-2607

No change. This action arises out of the denial by the Retirement System of Ms. Rossi's application for attorney's fees pursuant to the Equal Access to Justice Act, related to the earlier denial of her application for an accidental disability pension. The Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal has been filed with the Court. The matter has been fully briefed and assigned to Mr. Justice Rubine for decision.

Jane Robinson v. Frank J. Karpinski in his capacity as Executive Director of the Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island

Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 09-7019

No change. This action arises out of the denial by the Retirement System of Ms. Robinson's request to purchase service credit for time when she left teaching for maternity reasons. An Answer was filed. The Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal was filed on April 14, 2010. This matter has been fully briefed and assigned for decision.

Nancy Langlois v. Frank T. Caprio

Providence County Superior Court CA No. PC 10-0909

No change. This action arises out of the denial by the Retirement Board of Ms. Langlois's application to receive service credit for the time she worked reduced hours after she returned from maternity leave. An Answer and the Designation of the Administrative Record have been filed. On April 26, 2012, Mr. Justice Procaccini remanded the case to the Retirement Board for further proceedings. The matter was referred to the Hearing Officer for further consideration consistent with the April 26, 2012 decision. On October 24, 2012, the Hearing Officer issued a decision again affirming the administrative decision to deny Ms. Langlois's application to receive service credit. On December 12, 2012, the Retirement Board again voted to deny Ms. Langlois's request to obtain service credit. On January 21, 2013, Ms. Langlois filed a First Amended Complaint. The Retirement System's Answer and Amended Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal were filed on January 25, 2013.

Jennifer Leyden v. Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island

Providence County Superior Court CA No. 2012-1867

No change. This Administrative Appeal arises from Jennifer Leyden's claims that ERSRI wrongfully denied her application for an accidental disability pension. Ms. Leyden was a teacher for the Providence Public School System. The Retirement System's Answer was filed on June 4, 2012. The Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal was filed on June 5, 2012. The

matter was fully briefed and assigned to Mr. Justice Lanphear for decision. On June 5, 2013, Judge Lanphear issued a decision remanding the matter to the Retirement Board for further proceedings. On July 17, 2013, ERSRI filed a petition for issuance of a writ of certiorari with the Rhode Island Supreme Court. On June 11, 2014, the Rhode Island Supreme Court issued an order denying the petition for certiorari as a final judgment has not yet entered. Ms. Leyden filed a motion with the Superior Court attempting to restrict the system's ability to obtain an additional independent medical examination. On October 17, 2014, the Superior Court denied Ms. Leyden's motion.

Michael T. Brady v. Gina M. Raimondo, et al.

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.: PC 2013-5592

No change. Plaintiff is a disability retiree who brought this action against the Retirement System, the General Treasurer in her individual and official capacities, and the Executive Director in his individual and official capacities, seeking, *inter alia*, damages, and a determination that the Retirement System cannot make adjustments to his disability allowance based on earned income. The parties have stipulated that the Superior Court action will be held in abeyance while Plaintiff pursues administrative remedies.

Albert DelMastro, Jr. v. Employee's Retirement System of Rhode Island

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC14-1850

No change. Plaintiff, an electrician with the Community College of Rhode Island, appeals the denial of his application for an accidental disability pension. The Retirement System has filed an Answer and the Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal with the Court.

Retirement Board v. Rachel Arruda

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC14-6174

No change. This is an action to revoke or reduce Ms. Arruda's pension pursuant to the Public Employee Pension Revocation and Reduction Act. Ms. Arruda, a former employee of the City of Woonsocket, pled *nolo contendere* to a felony charge related to conversion of funds in connection with her municipal employment. At a hearing on January 29, 2015, Arruda stipulated to the suspension of her pension pending adjudication of the action.

The Retirement Board of the Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island v. Gerard M. Martineau

Providence County Superior Court; C.A. No. PC 15-1268

No change. This is an action to revoke or reduce Mr. Martineau's pension pursuant to the Public Employee Pension Revocation and Reduction Act. Mr. Martineau, a former elected official of the State of Rhode Island, pled *nolo contendere* to charges of Honest Services Mail Fraud in connection with his public employment. Mr. Martineau was served with the Complaint on April 2, 2015. Mr. Martineau has agreed to voluntarily relinquish any entitlement to a pension or other benefit he might otherwise have been entitled to, and documents necessary to obtain court approval of revocation of his pension have been sent to him for review.

Robert E. Falvey v. Seth Magaziner, et al.

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.: PC 2016-0232

No change. Plaintiff is a disability retiree who brought this action against the Retirement Board, the General Treasurer in his capacity as chair of the Board, the Executive Director, and the State of Rhode Island, seeking, *inter alia*, damages, and a determination that the Retirement System cannot make adjustments to his disability allowance based on earned income. The parties have stipulated that no Answer or other response shall be required to be filed until 30 days after Plaintiff's counsel states in writing that an Answer or other response is being requested.

Benita Fernandez v. Employee's Retirement System of Rhode Island

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No. PC2015-5489

No change. Plaintiff, a Social Caseworker II with DCYF, appeals the denial of her application for an accidental disability pension. The Retirement System has filed an Answer and the Designation of Record of Administrative Appeal with the Court.

Anne Marcaccio v. Central Falls Board of Trustees, and its Members, Anna Cano Morales, Sonia Grace, Hugo Figueroa, Stephanie Gonzalez, Diosa Martinez, Ana Cecilia Rosado, and Ronald Pitt, the North Smithfield School Committee, and its Members, Merredythe Nadeau, Arthur Bassett, Michael Clifford, William J. O'Connell, Liane M. Jalette, James J. Lombardi, III, and John E. Raymond and the Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island, by and through the General Treasurer, Seth Magaziner.

Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC 16-1210

No change. Plaintiff has brought this declaratory judgment action, with the stated intention of obtaining records from her former employers for use in connection with administrative

proceedings at ERSRI related to the calculation of service credit, and her corresponding eligibility for a service pension. ERSRI has filed an answer to the complaint.

Employees' Retirement System of Rhode Island v. Thomas McSoley, Marlene A. Palumbo, and Michael E. McSoley.

Providence Superior Court; C.A. No. PC2016-1144

No change. ERSRI brought suit to recover monies overpaid to a direct deposit account of Thomas McSoley, following his death in 2011. The defendants are believed to be joint account holders with the decedent. ERSRI effectuated service of process, and sought an injunction preventing the defendants from accessing or withdrawing the funds. On March 18, 2016, the parties entered into a Consent Order that restrains the defendants from accessing, withdrawing, encumbering, or otherwise spending or disposing of the funds on account until further order of the Court.

Alfred Benjamin v. Seth Magaziner, et al.

Providence County Superior Court C.A. No.: PC 2016-4467

No change. Plaintiff is a disability retiree who brought this action against the Retirement Board, the General Treasurer in his capacity as chair of the Board, the Executive Director, and the State of Rhode Island, seeking, *inter alia*, damages, and a determination that the Retirement System cannot make adjustments to his disability allowance based on earned income. The parties have stipulated that no Answer or other response shall be required to be filed until 30 days after Plaintiff's counsel states in writing that an Answer or other response is being requested.

III. Discussion and Consideration of the Effective Date of Eligibility for Teachers COLA

The Subcommittee reviewed the effective date of the "annual benefit adjustment" -- or cost of living adjustment (COLA)-- for Teachers who retire at the end of the school year and noted that the timing of COLA before pension reform was uniform since the COLA was paid to all eligible members in January regardless of their retirement anniversary date.

However, application of current board regulations results in teachers retiring at the end of the school year receiving their COLA one month later than teachers retiring at other times of the year.

Accordingly, to be consistent in application of the COLA with respect to teachers retiring at the end of the school year, the Subcommittee agreed that the COLA should also be standardized so that teachers retiring at the end of the school year receive their COLA in a similar timeframe as other teachers. A motion was duly made by Roger P. Boudreau and seconded by Mark A. Carruolo and it was unanimously

VOTED: To recommend to the Full Board that it promulgate a regulation to adjust the eligibility for the annual benefit adjustment for teachers who retire at the end of the school year.

Lisa A. Whiting-abstained.

IV. Member Education / Communications Update

Assistant Executive Director Kate Brock provided the Subcommittee with an updated timeline on communication improvements. She discussed each item with the committee and answered questions.

Ms. Brock then provided the Subcommittee with draft early and mid-career retirement presentations. The Subcommittee reviewed each of the presentations with Ms. Brock and offered comments and suggestions. Assistant Executive Director Kate Brock apprised the Subcommittee that at the next meeting there will be discussion and information for the Subcommittee to consider defined contribution counselling integration with the current defined benefit counselling. She said the System will provide information on financial planning, what other states are doing and strengths and weaknesses. She asked members to provide her with any other questions or information they may want to review and consider.

VI. Adjournment

There being no other business to come before the Subcommittee, on a motion by Roger P. Boudreau and seconded by Lisa A. Whiting, the meeting adjourned at 2:25 p.m.

Non-substitute teacher positions must be certified by the school as posted but unable to be filled with a non-retiree. Depending on the position being filled, a retired employee who returned to work as a substitute teacher is indicated by a Title/Function column as PRSB.

If a retired employee is returning to work as an administrator, guidance counselor, or other certified position in a school department, this is considered a vacancy position and labeled in the Title/Function column as PRAM. Certification letters (good faith letter) need to be provided by the agency and forwarded to ERSRI consistent with RIGL §16-16-24.

Municipal retirees returning to work in a school system are indicated in the *Title/* Function column as PRMS. Municipal retirees returning to work for a participating city/town are indicated as PRME.

Retirees working for a State College/University and allowed to earn up to \$18,000 gross yearly is indicated by PRIS.

Registered nurses working in a State facility including employment as a faculty member of a nursing program at a state-operated college or university are indicated as PRNR.

Persons exceeding the statutory limitations are notified by mail or email and provided an opportunity to dispute the reports received by this office, prior to 'docking' or suspension of their benefit.

Portfolio Highlights

June 2018

The Plan returned -0.23% during the month of June, outperforming the 60/40 benchmark, which returned -0.37%. The Total Plan benchmark returned -0.05%. The Stability bucket gained 0.27%, while the Growth and Income buckets detracted from performance, earning -0.60% and -0.11%, respectively. The total portfolio value decreased by approximately \$41.3 million as the investment portfolio returned -\$19.6 million and \$27.1 million of transfers were made to meet pension payroll in excess of pension contributions.

During the Fiscal Year, the total portfolio value increased by approximately \$258.1 million, through June. Fiscal year-to-date through June, the portfolio increased 8.03% net of fees, beating the plan benchmark return of 7.59% and the 60% global equity/40% fixed income benchmark return of 6.25%. The Total Growth Composite drove performance, returning 12.71%. The Public Growth allocation returned 11.48% and outperformed its benchmark by 75 basis points, due in part to the outperformance of the Plan's QVM strategy, which returned 12.26% and outperformed its benchmark by 117 basis points. The period's \$636.7 million of positive investment performance was offset by \$378.7 million in transfers to meet pension payroll in excess of pension contributions.

Calendar year-to-date the portfolio's 0.73% net return outperformed the 60/40 return of -0.83%, as well as the strategic benchmark return of 0.56%. Over this period, the total portfolio value has decreased by \$121.8 million, with net investment gains of \$60.4 million and \$182.2 million of transfers to meet pension payroll.

Over a 3-year time frame, the ERSRI portfolio outperformed, earning an annualized return of 6.34% net of fees versus the plan benchmark of 6.03% and the 60/40 portfolio which earned 5.71%. Over a 5-year time frame, the ERSRI portfolio earned an annualized return of 7.20% net of fees, outperforming the plan benchmark return of 6.99% and 60/40 benchmark, which posted 6.64%.

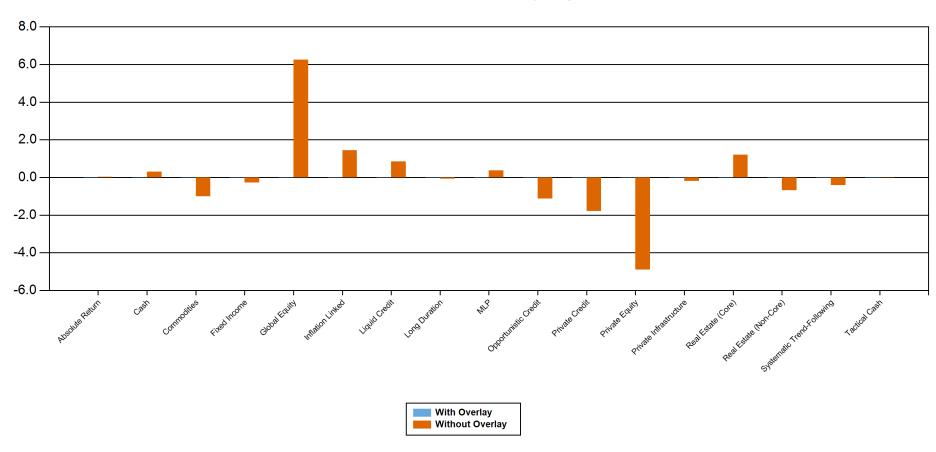

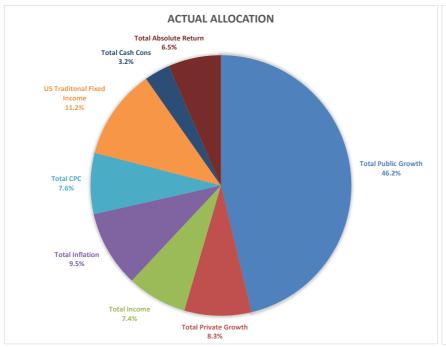


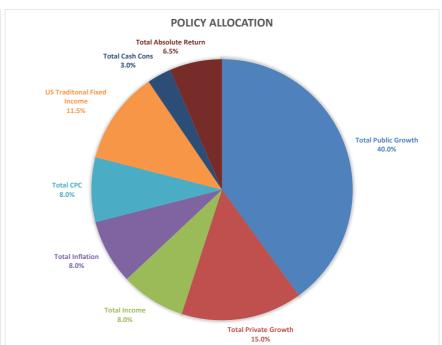
Policy Allocation

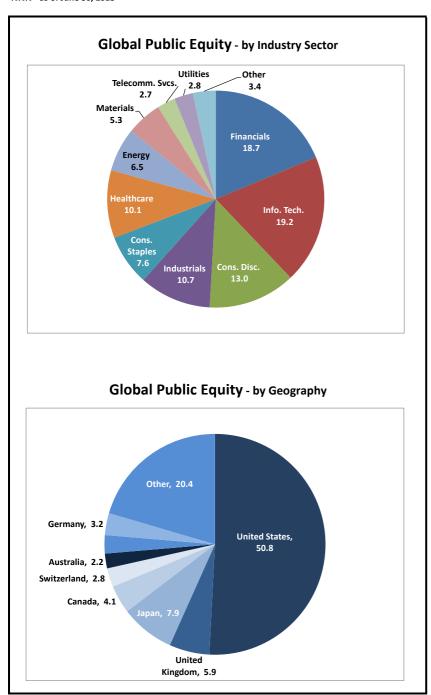


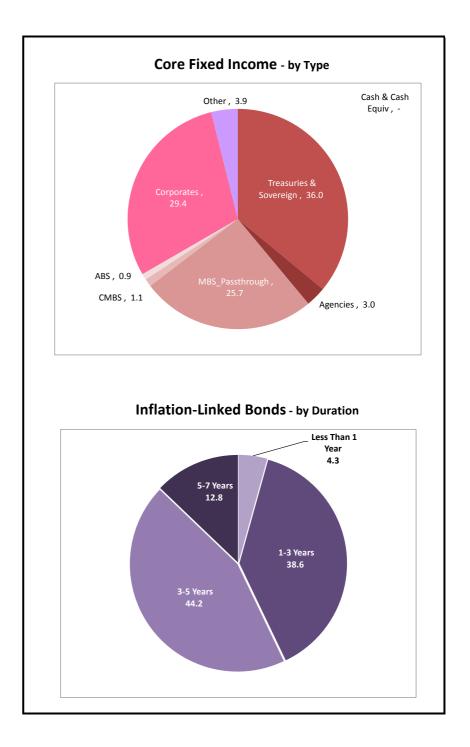


ERSRI Asset Allocation

State Investment Commission Monthly Meeting Minutes Wednesday,

June 27^{the}, 2018 9:00 a.m. Executive Conference Room, Department of Administration

The Monthly Meeting of the State Investment Commission (SIC) was called to order at 9:06 AM, Wednesday, June 27^{the}, 2018 in the Executive Conference Room, Department of Administration.

I. Roll Call of Members

The following members were present: Mr. Michael Costello, Ms. Sylvia Maxfield, Mr. Thomas Mullaney, Ms. Marcia Reback, Mr. Robert Benson, Ms. Karen Hammond, Mr. Frank Karpinski, Mr. Erik Carleton, and Treasurer Seth Magaziner.

Also in attendance: Mr. Tom Lynch, Cliffwater; Mr. Loren Schlachet and Mr. Erick Bronner, Riverside; Ms. Tiffany Spudich and Mr. Peter Harvey, Capital Cities; Mr. David Iden and Mr. Larry Brown, TIAA; Mr. Alec Stais, Chief Investment Officer; Ms. Sally Dowling and Ms. Nicole Verdi, Adler, Pollock & Sheehan, legal counsel; Mr. Doug Moseley and Mr. Will Forde, NEPC; and other members of the Treasurer's staff.

Treasurer Magaziner called the meeting to order at 9:06 AM.

II. Approval of Minutes

On a motion by Ms. Maxfield and seconded by Ms. Hammond, it was unanimously **VOTED**: to approve the draft minutes of the May 23rd, 2018 meeting of the State Investment Commission.

III. Private Equity Investment Recommendation, Riverside Miro-Cap Fund V

Mr. Tom Lynch introduced Mr. Loren Schlachet and Mr. Erick Bronner from Riverside. Mr. Schlachet provided an overview of Riverside as a firm before discussing his background. He highlighted the depth and experience of the RMCF team. Mr. Schlachet described the fund's standardized processes and analytical tools, which facilitate a consistent approach to buying, building and selling companies. He walked the Board through the typical stages of a RMCF investment, noting the teams responsible for each stage of the process. He discussed the fund's investment strategy, noting target company characteristics and sector focus. Mr. Schlachet emphasized RMCF's strong realized acquisition to exit EBITDA growth, citing the roles of organic growth and add-on acquisitions in the value creation process. He illustrated some of the steps taken to transform the portfolio companies sold to date; namely, management upgrades, sales initiatives, and working capital improvements. Mr. Schlachet walked the Board through a couple of successful portfolio company case studies and referenced RMCF realization statistics. Mr. Bronner provided a summary of the terms and expected close. Mr. Lynch summarized Riverside's fit in the Plan's overall Private Equity portfolio.

The Board asked questions.

On a motion by Ms. Maxfield which was seconded by Ms. Reback, it was unanimously **VOTED: that the Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island make a commitment up to a \$40 million**

investment in Riverside Micro-Cap Fund V, subject to legal and investment staff review.

IV. Investment Policy Statement and Benchmark Update

Mr. Alec Stais reminded the board that the broad IPS language had been changed a few years ago in light of the asset/liability study. He noted that a few remaining changes to the IPS are still necessary in order for the IPS to align with the new asset allocation adopted by the board in 2016, including small changes to some of the sub-asset class benchmarks. He presented updated IPS language for the board to consider.

On a motion by Mr. Mullaney which was seconded by Ms. Reback, excluding Ms. Hammond, who abstained, it was unanimously VOTED: that the Employees' Retirement System of the State of Rhode Island adopt the proposed Defined Benefit Investment Policy Statement and Benchmark adjustments.

V. 529 Review, Capital Cities

Ms. Tiffany Spudich provided background on her firm and briefly described its relationship with Rhode Island's 529 program. She explained that Capital Cities is not currently recommending any changes to the program's investment menu, but they will be closely monitoring the 2017 tax reform's impact on other programs across the industry. Ms. Spudich summarized the structure of the investment products offered across both the direct and advisor 529 plans. She reviewed the program's individual portfolios' menu and reminded the board of the upcoming name change to the Invesco Global Sustainable Equity Portfolio. Ms. Spudich then overviewed the target risk and aged-based portfolios' menu. She referenced a graphic that compares Rhode Island's age-based glide path to that of Morningstar's peer group. Ms. Spudich explained the investment manager qualitative and quantitative review processes. She noted that overall the portfolio investment lineup was in good shape, but noted that three underlying funds—Diversified Dividend, International Growth, and Global Growth Funds—should be monitored. She elaborated on the comparative fee charts published in the Capital Cities meeting materials, describing efforts to continue reducing fees beyond what is already considered to be a relatively low-cost program. Ms. Spudich concluded by recommending a change to the IPS language to reflect the changes to 529 plans made in the recent tax reform.

The Board asked questions.

On a motion by Mr. Costello which was seconded by Ms. Reback, it was unanimously **VOTED: to** implement the proposed update to the Investment Policy Statement for the Rhode Island Tuition Savings Program (CollegeBound Saver and CollegeBound 529).

VI. 401/457 Review, TIAA

Mr. David Iden reviewed TIAA's Rhode Island member engagement and outreach statistics during the first calendar quarter. He noted the recent attention that has been given to the 457 multi-vendor coordinator implementation and referenced the vendor-agnostic Retirement@work website. Mr. Larry Brown referenced the Market Values for the 401a plan as of May 31. He noted that the Vanguard Total Bond Market Index Admiral has qualified for the cheaper share class, resulting in a change from 5 to 4 basis points. He also pointed out that roughly 96% of the 401a assets are indexed. Mr. Brown summarized performance across TIAA's Rhode Island 401a and 457 plans.

The Board asked questions.

VII. Legal Counsel Report

There was no legal counsel report

VIII.Chief Investment Officer Report

Mr. Stais reviewed the Plan's fiscal year-to-date performance, breaking down returns at the functional and asset class levels.

The Board asked questions.

IX. Treasurer's General Comments

Treasurer Magaziner noted the Plan's outperformance relative to the 60/40 benchmark and the plan benchmark.

On a motion by Mr. Mullaney and seconded by Ms. Maxfield, it was unanimously **VOTED: to adjourn** the meeting at 10:42 AM.

Portfolio Highlights

July 2018

The Plan returned 1.51%, net of fees, during the month of July, outperforming the Total Plan benchmark return of 1.31%. The positive performance was driven by the Growth and Income buckets, which earned 2.65% and 2.07%, respectively. The Public Growth aggregate asset class was the portfolio's top contributor, earning 3.05% and outperforming the MSCI ACWI Index, which returned 3.02%. This outperformance was due largely in part to the portfolio's QVM factor-tilt allocation, which returned 3.48% and outperformed its benchmark, the MSCI World Index, by 36 basis points. The total portfolio value increased by approximately \$103.2 million as the investment portfolio returned \$125.2 million and \$27.1 million of transfers were made to meet pension payroll in excess of pension contributions.

Calendar year-to-date the portfolio's 2.25% net return outperformed the 60/40 return of 0.97%, as well as the strategic benchmark return of 1.81%. Over this period, the total portfolio value has decreased by \$18.6 million, with net investment gains of \$185.6 million and \$204.2 million of transfers to meet pension payroll.

Over a 3-year time frame, the ERSRI portfolio outperformed, earning an annualized return of 6.68% net of fees versus the plan benchmark of 6.34% and the 60/40 portfolio which earned 6.06%. Over a 5-year time frame, the ERSRI portfolio earned an annualized return of 6.95% net of fees, outperforming the plan benchmark return of 6.71% and 60/40 benchmark, which posted 6.41%.

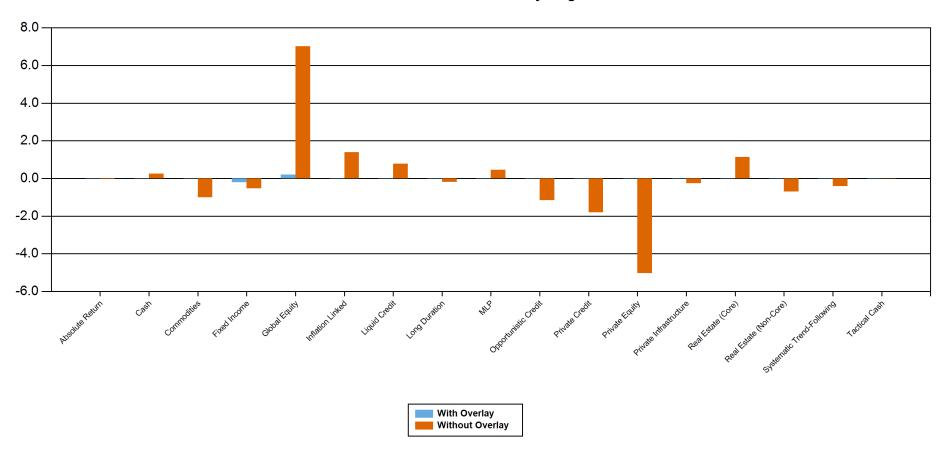

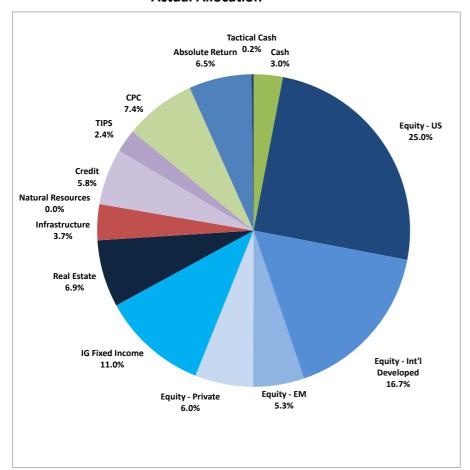

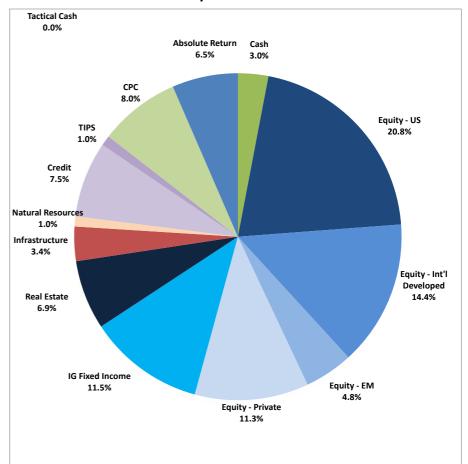

Actual Allocation

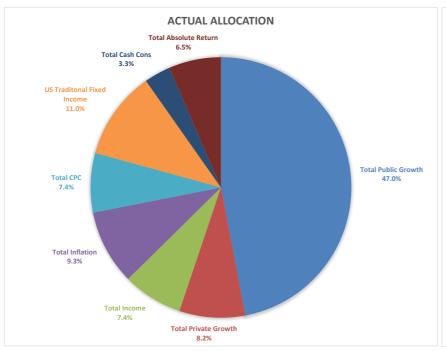


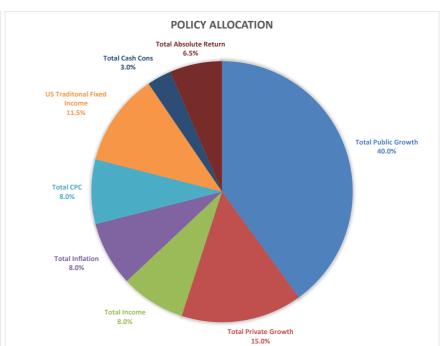
Policy Allocation

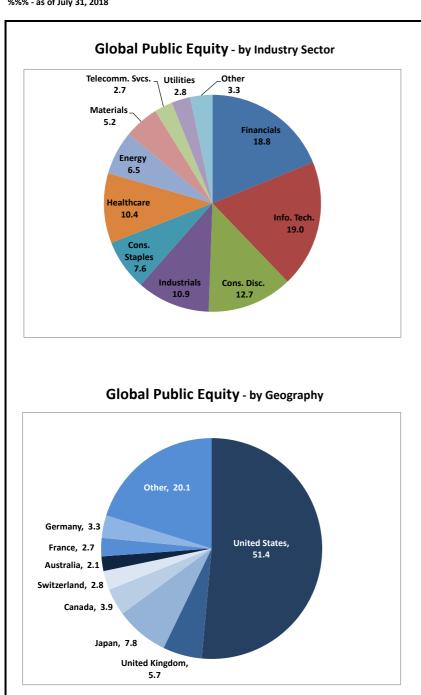

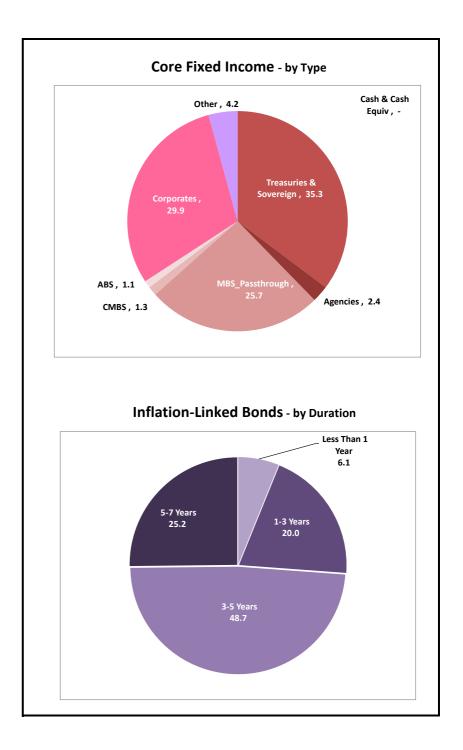




Public-Asset Portfolios

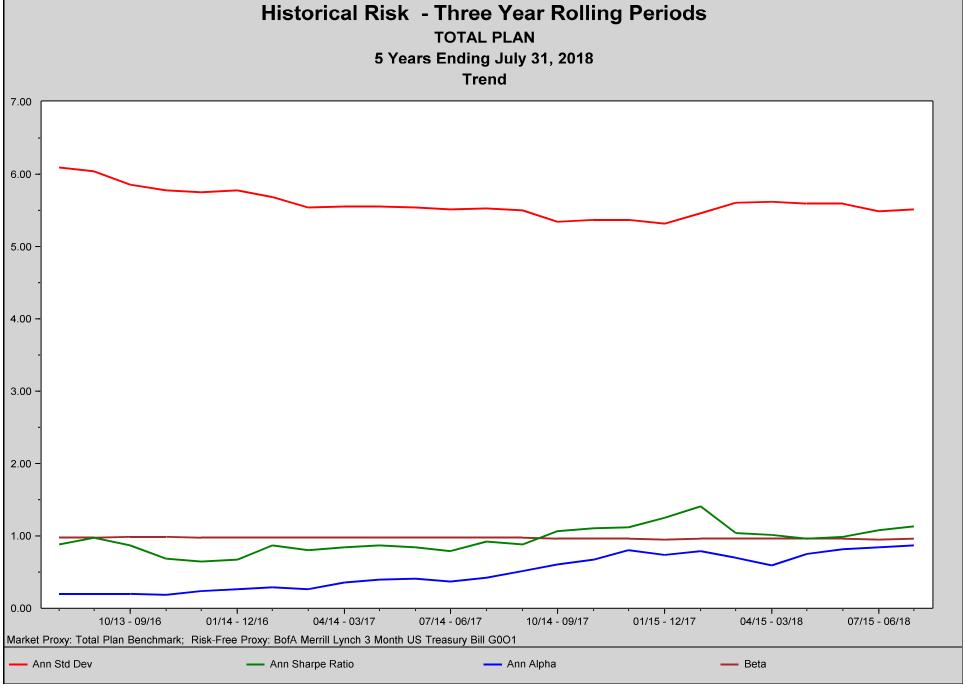
